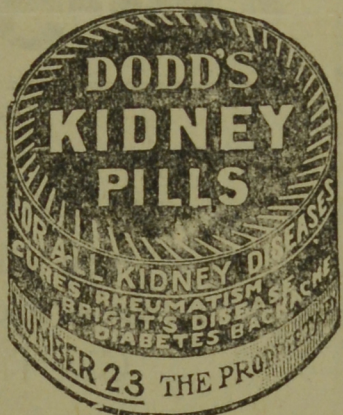

## PRESS COMMENTS ON MRS. PANKHURST

London, April 7.—There are a few editorial comments on Mrs. Pankhurst. The Chronicle points out that three years in the shortest period for which a prisoner can be sentenced to penal servitude and a light penalty on the second conviction for such an offence. A laborer who burned a rick in an ordinary way would get five years at least.

The News: "For three years Mrs. Pankhurst will be out of action whether in or out of prison. There is an unpleasant prospect before us of a prolonged duel between woman and the law refuses to recognize as valid, unfortunately. The only effect is to make the concession of justice to women remoter. Never was heroism more hopelessly ill-judged."

"Mrs. Pankhurst," says the Standard, "is either more influenced by a passion for power and notoriety than by a desire to promote the best interests of the suffragist cause, or she lacks the moral courage to admit that she has been doing wrong. Either assumption is fatal to her pretension of respect as the representative of a serious cause." The Standard adds that another fact whereof Mrs. Pankhurst must be aware is that many women are suffering real and permanent degradation in her service. Much of the dirty work of the militant is done by hirelings but there are others, decent girls and married women, who are carried away by the artificial excitement and hysterical enthusiasm of the militant meetings to make criminals of themselves, to be sent to jail, and to go through hunger-strikes and the consequent degradations. It is useless to pretend that contact with criminal law and the experiences of prison can be otherwise than prejudicial to female modesty. Womanliness is a decent flower that cannot long survive the atmosphere of rowdiness which Mrs. Pankhurst has done so much to create."

The Daily Graphic: "The public are sick of the antics and crimes of these fanatical women and there is the gravest danger that the mob may at any moment make good the weakness of the law."

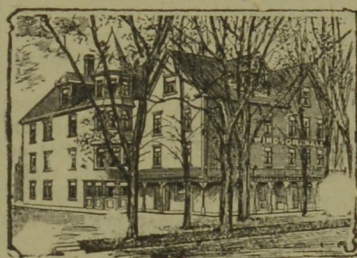
