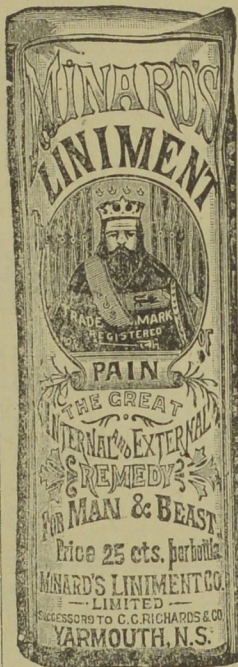

FOR ADEQUATE NAVY

Washington, D.C., April 3.—An attempt to construe the Democratic platform declaration in favor of a "adequate navy" is to be made at the convention of the Navy League, which will be held in this city tomorrow and Friday. One of the papers to be discussed is devoted to that subject, and others relate to such matters as "Strategic Value of the Panama Canal to the Navy," "The Consolidation of Navy Yards and Stations in the Light of Strategy and Economy," and "Wanted, A Naval Policy." The convention will conclude with a dinner on Friday night in honor of Secretary Daniels.

The Navy League of the United States was incorporated under the laws of the State of New York on January 2, 1903, its declared object being "to acquire and spread before the citizens of the United States, through branch organizations and otherwise, information as to the condition of the naval forces and equipment of the United States and to awaken public interest and co-operation in all matters tending to aid, improve and develop their efficiency." It is strictly non-partisan and men, women and children are eligible to membership.

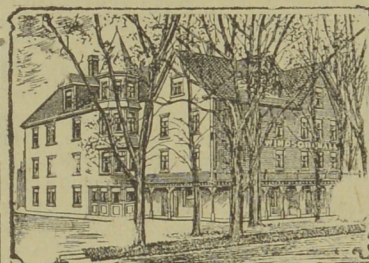

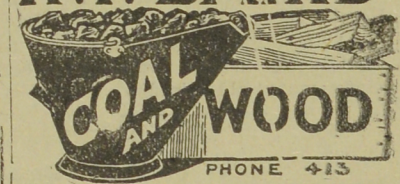
