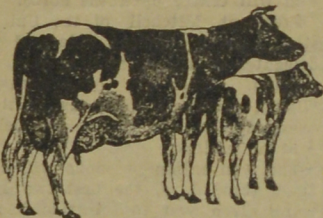

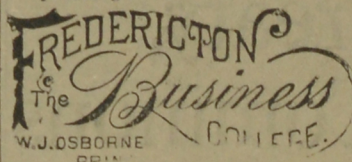

SOME REMINISCENCES OF
TORY RULE IN CANADA

(St. John Telegraph.)

Sir Joseph Pope has written a booklet attempting to vindicate Sir John MacDonald from some of the things laid to his charge in Cartwright's "Reminiscences." In a few detailed items he says that Cartwright's memory fails him and that he is unjust to his mighty opponent but even if the contentions of Mr. Pope are true there is sufficient left in Sir Richard's book to make very interesting reading.

In bringing up those early days it may be profitable to recall the extraordinary conditions that existed in Canada under the last Conservative regime. The Weekly Dispatch of August 9, 1891, says: "The secret of Sir John's electoral victories is out. On this side of the water surprise has often been expressed at the patience with which our Canadian cousins submitted to the Tory-Protectionist rule of that prince of political intrigues. There is now alas, no difficulty in explaining the curious situation Sir John's government rested on a stupendous and all prevailing system of bribery and corruption. Even Tammany Hall smells sweet and clean in comparison with the stink pot of Sir John's government. Day by day the revelations that are going on at Ottawa disclose a huge system of corruption that would make old Walpole green with envy. The public works department was tainted and rotten to the core. Every contract was given to political supporters, they bargained for enormous prices and paid back a portion of their ill-gotten gains to ministers and their friends. The confessions of Mr. Thomas McGreevy, M.P., a close friend of Sir Hector Langevin, Sir John's designated successor, read like a romance in the pages of rascality. Sometimes even the contracts were made to mythical persons, so that no portion of the swag might escape the greedy politician. Presents of steam yachts, carriages, horses, jewelry and diamonds were constantly made to officials. Altogether such an exposure has seldom been made in the annals of political corruption. Boss Tweed was not in it with Sir John and his gang."

No one imputed to Sir John the actual receipt of a bribe. It was chiefly his "gang" that looked after that and the record of the Government of that day was read with sorrow and shame by the English-speaking race. Rascals out of office defrauded the public in order to bribe rascals in office; and rascals in office prostituted their honor and forsook their trust in order to keep on good terms with the rascals out of office. But even Lord Salisbury hailed the result of the Canadian elections in 1891 as proof that the royalists of Canada still held the heart of the Queen, disregarding the facts that they had been carried by a system of bribery and by thefts of public money more shameful and odious than any which history reveals in the annals of reputable nations. The cause of loyalty, then as now, was identified with the cause

of corruption. There are many notes in the gamut of ignorance, but it is noticeable that Austen Chamberlain strikes the same ones now, in his comments on the last Tory victory, that his predecessor did then.

Under the "loyal" government, the public works department was nothing more or less than a national bribery bureau. Mr. Borden has spent much money in an effort to detect some shadow of those conditions in the administration of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. Not the slightest irregularity could be detected by the most malignant scrutiny. This honesty and uprightness in public administration will now be changed—in the name of loyalty. Mr. Rogers gives many indications of reversion to type. His record in the election in Winnipeg, and, later, in the local election in Antigonish, makes it quite easy to forecast the result if he is long in charge. Canada is bound to have to return to earlier conditions when Mr. Borden sets about repaying the manufacturers by high duties, and the contractors by fat contracts, for their assistance in the last election.

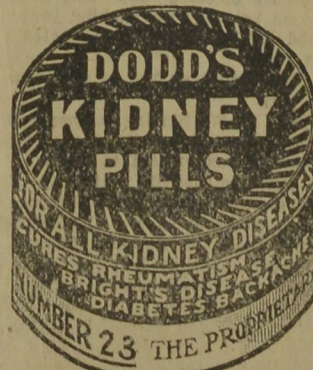
A ROMANCE OF THE

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION

The City of Fredericton will present at the approaching Session of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick the following bills for enactment:

(1) A Bill authorizing the City to grant certain concessions to the Palmer-McLellan Company, Limited, and to fix the valuation of the property of Frasers Limited in this City for taxation purposes.

(2) A Bill to authorize the issue of Debentures for the erection of a Fire Station, a Police Station, for the purchase of Queen's Park and for the further construction of Permanent Street Pavements, not exceeding in the whole the sum of Forty-five Thousand Dollars (\$45,000).

(3) A Bill to provide for lighting by electricity the Fredericton and St. Mary's Highway Bridge.

PINEAPPLE DROPS
