

Even New Creatures must make pro-

Spirit's guidance; as they become "meat in due season." Even New Creatures must make pro-gress in their appreciation of spirit-ual things. The Apostle urges such: "As new born babes desire the sin-cere milk of the Word, that ye might grow thereby." And the growth is necessary if they would attain joint-heirship in the Kingdom; hence the Apostle urges that each seek not to continue a babe, but to become a man, and to use the "strong meat" of Di-vine Truth. Thus he is sanctified, developed as a New Creature, filled with the Spirit, and "thoroughly fur-nished unto every good work," by knowledge of the Word of God. Now our text: "The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit and they are life." Here our Lord endeav-ored to impress His dear disciples with the thought that they should not take His words too literally, but look for the deeper meaning. And, they were to remember that they could not get that deep meaning until after the Master's ascension; as He said, "It is expedient for you that I go away; for if I go not away the Holy Spirit will not come unto you; but if I go away I will send Him unto you." The Master's words were "words of life" in that they conveyed the great Message of the terms upon which we may have everlasting life and become His joint-heirs. Although the Apos-tles explain the philosophy of the Di-vine Plan in great detail, more than did Jesus, yet in His saying we find the very essence of the Gospel. No-where are the terms of discipleship more carefully laid down than in Jesus' words, because the disciples could understand the meaning of self-denial, cross-bearing, and walking in His step, even if they could not un-

Jesus' words, because the disciples could understand the meaning of self-denial, cross-bearing, and walking in His step, even if they could not un-derstand the philosophy of justifica-tion, sanctification, election and Di-vine foreknowledge. From Jesus' words more clearly than from any others we get the thought of the "water of life," and how it is now in His followers a "spring" of truth, grace and everlast-ing life. Nowhere eles do we more clearly get the statement that the Father hath life in Himself, and hath granted unto the Son life in Himself, and that He might share this life with His disciples—with whomsoever He would. Thus, as St. Paul says, the words of this salvation began to be spoken by our Lord. He brought "life" and "immortality" to light, both the general reward of everlasting life to be given to the world, and the special reward to be granted to the Church.
