





## HE WAS IN JAIL

Cn June 19th, 1912, the Marin and Fisheries agent at Halifax wrote the Deputy Minister that Captain Landry was "not attending to his duties," and added the surprising explanation "owing to his being con-fined in jail." The agent also asked that some one be appointed in Cap Landry's place. Later on the Deputy Minister wrote Mr. Gillies as to successor to Captain Landry. Gillies replied on July 3 that the duties of the position were being well dooked after by Captain Aime Langlois, though, strange to say, there is nothing iin the return to indicate that any authority had been given Captain Langlois to take the work. Continuing his letter, however, Mr. Gillies wrote that 'Captain Landry will be home in few days, when he can resume his duties as wharfinger. I presume that this will be satisfactory to the de-partment. If, however, it is absolutely necessary to appoint a whar-finger, I recommend Captain Langlois for that position, but I don't wish this done, as Landry himself will be home in' a few days."
