



Mr. Carson said that some twelve or fodreen months ago the question of fodreen months ago the question for the establishment of a prison arm came up befflore the Municipal Jouncil for the City and County of St. John and it had been voted down. 'It presented itself again last fall and was carried with a very small majority. $H_{\rm E}$ felt that those favorable to the bill did not take inconsideration necessary to equip and maintain such an institution.

Hon. Mr. Wilson agreed with his colleague from St. John, Mr. Tilley, that the establishment of the prison farm would entail a very large ex-pense and that while the municipal ity of St. John enjoyed a very large ity of St. John enjoyed a very large revenue he felt sure they would not take advantage of this legislation.
