On one previous occasion witness had instructed Lavine to get McLellan's signature.

STOCK MARKET

New York, N. Y., Jan. 25.—The unfavorable foreign news were dominating influences in yesterday's stock market. In the absence of disturbances from that source, the market might have enjoyed a fair recovery, inasmuch as it has been apparent for several days that bear drives were forcing no liquidation and that a large short interest was outstanding. The domestic situation and the prospect is still of a character to sustain bearish confidence for large interests show no disposition to lend aggressive support to prices. Unless, however, there are some fresh developments of disturbing character the edge will gradually be worn off of bear talk by persistent reiteration.

called upon to give explanation to the chief. Suggestions made at any time to the chief by the chairman of the Fire Committee are to receive "due consideration." Roll-call is to be held after every fire at the station to mark those absent from or present at a fire. Only members of the Fire Department are to be about a station on Sunday. A substitute is to be provided when any fireman leaves the city.

DIFFERENCE OF OPINION

Difference of opinion on the part of Ald. Cruikshank and Chief Rutter was observed at various stages of the discussion.

The chief doubted very much the necessity of placing in the by-law the section making it necessary for him to give "due consideration" to suggestions of the chairman of the Fire Committee. Such a section would make absolutely no difference so far as he was concerned. He always had given consideration to a suggestion offered by any man. If the suggestion was worthless he discarded it.

Ald. Cruikshank suggested that the chief give consideration with a certain amount of argument.

"With none" was the reply. "Did you not argue with me at the Queen Hotel fire?" asked Mr. Cruikshank.

"No, you argued with me" was the answer.

In the matter of changing the pay system and of having roll-call there was another clash. Ald. Cruikshank stated that he wanted roll-call at a fire. He knew of members of the department who did not attend fires. Chief Rutter objected saying that in the case of false alarms and small fires the firemen could more readily go to the station.

"You will continue to have the system of fines," said the chief discussing the proposed change in the system of pay.

"We won't if the Fire Committee says not" was Ald. Cruikshank's answer.

POTATO PRICES IN MONCTON AND WOODSTOCK

Woodstock, N. B., Jan. 23.—Dealers are offering 80 cents a barrel for potatoes and very few are coming in, the farmers waiting for a rise in price. It is the opinion of many dealers that owing to the condition of the market, the price will go still lower and probably reach 60 cents a barrel.

In Houlton the dealers are paying \$1.40 a barrel in spite of the transportation facilities being hampered by the strike on the B. & A. railroad. It is expected that Houlton prices will still further advance.

Hay in Carleton county is selling at \$8 a ton. In Houlton yesterday farmers were paid \$17 a ton. The organs of the "special interests" which shrieked themselves hoarse in preaching blue ruin for the farmers will hardly be able to sustain their exaggerated role in the face of these facts.

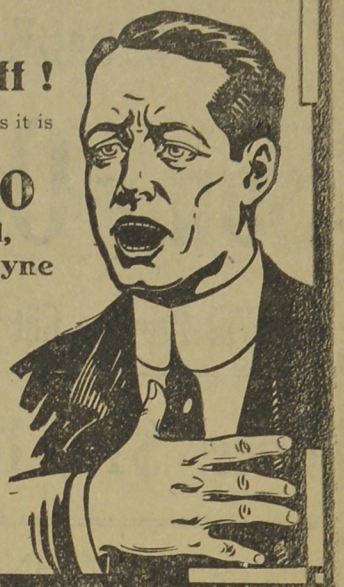
