UPON PROTECTION**

London, April 8.—The Daily News this morning editorially welcomes President Wilson's tariff bill as the heaviest blow struck at protection since Peel established free trade in England. It declares the introduction of the bill to be an event of supreme moment not only to the United States, but to the world. It describes the bill as a shattering attack upon the whole fabric of protection, and brings the United States at one huge stride within sight of free trade. Its effect on this country remains to be seen.

"Many years ago," it says, "Gladstone predicted our supremacy would remain unchallenged until the United States adopted free trade and then it would be seriously threatened. We do not fear competition as long as we retain the system that brought us such abundant prosperity. Free trade is a blessing, not to one country at the expense of the others, but to all countries that share its fertilizing influences."

**MUST UNDO SLOWLY.**

The Daily Chronicle this morning editorially says:

"British tariff reformers will try and comfort themselves by reflecting that the President is not a free trader because he does not propose at one stroke to chop off the whole of the protectionist duties in the United States, but judged by this test neither Peel nor Gladstone was a free trader. They recognized, as Wilson does, that a nation can only free itself of bondage to tariff by degrees. That indeed is one of the worst features of protection, that you can establish it in haste, but must undo it slowly. We do not mind what Wilson calls himself or what British tariffists call him while he inspires legislation of this character. Every word of it is a blow to free America from the same chains that tariff reform would fain forge for Great Britain."

**TARIFF REFORM PAPERS' VIEWS**

The Daily Express, which is a strong advocate of reform in the British tariff and the introduction of food taxes, declares that the changes proposed by the new American tariff are entirely consonant with the policy and aims of British tariff reformers, who will congratulate President Wilson on his excellent intention in lowering the Chinese wall which has been built around the commerce and manufactures of the country, inevitably encouraging the abuse of trusts and monopolies.

The Daily Graphic says Wilson's scheme recalls Peel's famous budget in 1842, when some 700 articles were

**HAS NO MANDATE  
ON NAVAL QUESTION**

(Toronto Globe.)

The government and parliament of Canada have no mandate from the people to pass the Borden naval bill now before the House of Commons. To pass that measure would be an arbitrary use of power to which no Canadian intelligently loyal to the principles and traditions of British freedom will submit. And to pass that measure by the brute-force closure methods of an arrogant majority would in itself constitute a betrayal of freedom of speech, and would merit public condemnation no matter how harmless or how beneficial the measure at issue.

If Mr. Borden's pre-election promises have for him any obligation he is pledged to a plebiscite or some other adequate reference to the electors. He pledged himself up to the hilt. Supporters of his, English and French, were elected on signed Bourassa pledges. The pretence that these pledges were confined to what he now calls a "permanent" policy is the veriest quibbling with words, unworthy of any responsible gentleman. The pledges he gave his Nationalist allies bound himself and the three Nationalists he afterwards called to his cabinet. One alone has kept those pledges, and out of respect for their obligations has retired from the government. Mr. Monk knows that the present proposals of a "contribution" or a "gift," whether for the North Sea or for Gibraltar, without a reference to the electors, dishonor the pledged word of the Prime Minister. Mr. Monk alone has kept faith with himself and the public.

The clamor of the government members in their refusal to go back to their constituents is noisy and defiant in proportion as their conduct is compromised and indefensible. They trust to campaign hysteria and their old-time pseudo-loyalty to befog the issue in the eyes of the country. But the national interests of Canada and of all the autonomous British dominions are of more importance than the exigencies of politicians. The struggle ought never to have been forced anew. But no matter what comes, Liberals and all true Loyalists, in Canada and the empire over, stand today and will stand tomorrow where they stood in all the yesterdays of the upward struggle for responsible government. And they will win. Time and the true British imperial idea are on their side. The mandate of the people alone is the guiding authority for any government among any people of the British breed.

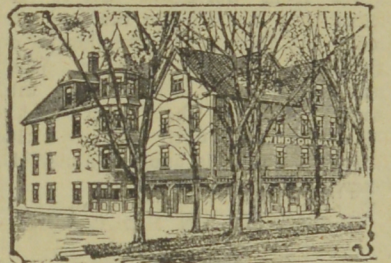
