All of which is respectfully submitted.

The report was adopted.

OFFICIALS RE-APPOINTED.

The following officials were re-appointed:

Fred St. John Bliss, secretary-treasurer.

Hon. H. F. McLeod, auditor.

Mrs. A. O. J. Glen, assistant secretary-treasurer.

The chaplain, reporters, constable and warden were voted the usual fees.

The matter of payment of a bill for \$33 for witnesses' fees for a case from Millville, in which Frank Flemming had been charged with violating the Canada Temperance Act, was brought up by Coun. Everett. The case had been dismissed.

The matter was referred to the Canada Temperance Act committee.

Explanation was asked regarding the item of \$30, the amount of a bill of R. A. Cropley, for printing sixty copies of the administration of justice accounts.

Secretary-Treasurer Bliss explained that the same amount had been paid Mr. Cropley for the same work in previous years.

The charge was declared by some of the councillors to be excessive.

BY-LAWS PASSED.

On the motion of Coun. Graham, the by-laws were amended so as to provide a pound district for that portion of Prince William between Pokiook Stream and Waterloo Brook.

On the motion of Coun. McMullin, Magaguadavic School District No. 7 and Blaney Ridge School District No. 6 were made pound districts.

Coun. J. H. Noble moved that a by-law be adopted establishing three new pound districts in the Parish of Bright, Districts No. 4, 5 and 6.

Coun. Neill moved that a committee of three be appointed to consider the advisability of establishing a poor farm for the County of York.

At his request Secretary-Treasurer Bliss gave statistics showing that the average annual expenditure for the maintenance of the poor over a period of thirteen years had been \$3,711.62.


