**PUGSLEY TURNED TABLES
ON THE TORIES**

Ottawa, April 18—There were lively
 times in the house between three
 and four o'clock this morning after
 Hon. Mr. Pugsley had insisted upon
 the house going on with the public
 business instead of adjourning. The
 house had been moved into supply in
 the afternoon to enable the opposi-
 tion to discuss the charges against
 Hon. Robert Rogers in connection
 with western lands, and continued
 until 2 a. m. when the vote was taken.

Then the government wished to ad-
 journ, but Dr. Pugsley protested
 that the opposition had been accused
 of obstructing public business and
 now when the house was in com-
 mittee of supply the government
 wished to adjourn without passing a
 single item. The result was distinct
 victory for opposition, for the gov-
 ernment took up civil service esti-
 mates and continued for nearly two
 hours. The neat way the tables were
 reversed upon the government has
 occasioned much comment.

Hon. O. Turgeon, M. P., for Glou-
 cester, received a great reception this
 morning from the Liberal members
 assembled in caucus because of the
 news that his son Grey Turgeon has
 been elected for the riding of Rid-
 stone in Alberta. Mr. Turgeon was
 opposed by a strong candidate and
 the first news gave his opponent the
 seat. Later returns, however, elect-
 ed Mr. Turgeon.

Another French-Canadian from New
 Brunswick, Hector Landry, son of
 Judge Landry, was a Conservative
 candidate and was not so fortunate,
 being defeated by Boudreau, formerly
 of Quebec.

Mr. Turgeon, M. P., for Gloucester
 has now one son attorney-general of
 Saskatchewan and another in the Al-
 bert house. Later telegrams say
 there will be forty Liberals and six-
 teen Tories in the Alberta legisla-
 ture.

James A. Short, president of the
 building trades department of the
 American Federation of Labor, has
 gone to Los Angeles, Calif., to
 organize the building trades workers
 in that city.

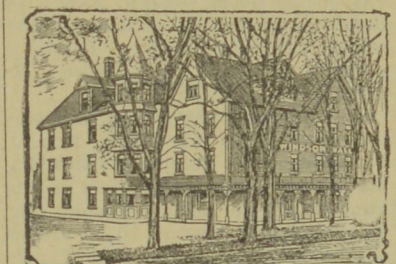
