## BIG MONEY IN RAISING GOATS IN MEXICO

We take the following from the  
Daily Consular Report No. 50 issued  
by the Department of Commerce and  
Labor of the United States at Wash-  
ington, D. C., Thursday, September  
1st, 1910 in which the U. S. Consul  
to Mexico W. W. Canada says:—

"The total importation of goat  
skins into the United States during  
the year ending June 30th, 1909  
amounted to 104,048,244 pounds,  
valued at \$25,913,914. The value of  
the goat depends on three things;  
meat, tallow and the skin. The flesh  
alone would make it a profitable in-  
dustry for the carcass of each animal  
would bring from \$1.00 to \$1.50. Fats  
of all kinds are high priced in all  
parts of this country. There is a  
steady demand for tallow at from 12  
to 15 cents per pound. At 2 years  
old a fat goat will yield from 6 to 10  
pounds of clear tallow, which will be  
worth from 75 cents to \$1.50. The  
most valuable part of the goat is the  
skin, worth \$1.25 to \$1.50 and the  
constant trend of prices is upward.  
There are buyers of goat skins where  
ever skins are to be had. Breeders  
need not seek a market. The goats  
breed twice a year, and after the  
first year, with rare exceptions, they  
will bring forth 2 and not unfre-  
quently 3 kids. The kids are hardy  
and need little care. After the  
first day they will shift for them-  
selves and require no attention. At  
8 months of age, the goat breeds  
A careful investment of \$1000 well  
looked after can certainly be counted  
upon to double itself inside of 2 1/2  
years, and to give at least a 50 per  
cent. profit per annum from the end  
of the second year." Consul Canada  
adds:

The following statement furnished  
at my request, will serve as an illu-  
stration of how the business of goat  
raising is conducted on a hacienda in  
the State of Guerrero.

## MILITARY WEDDING AT WASHINGTON

Washington, D. C., Jan. 2—The

neering corps of the army. The best  
man and ushers were all brother offi-  
cers of the bridegroom while nearly  
all of the bride's attendants were  
daughters of prominent army officers.  
Following the ceremony at the  
church there was a reception at the  
home of the bride's parents in Mass-  
achusetts avenue.

"In 1904 the manager of the farm  
received 66,000 goats, including large  
and small, at a valuation of \$1.50  
each, equal to \$99,000. From the  
produce of these he sold, during nine  
months of 1904 and the years 1905  
and 1906, 50,000 head at \$5.00 each,  
equal to \$250,000, and had at the  
close of 1906, 88,000 head on the  
farm, being 22,000 more than he  
started with. The result was, count-  
ing the value of the 22,000 increase  
at \$1.50 each with the foregoing sales  
the investment of \$99,000 produced  
in less than 3 years of 66,000 goats  
was intact."

desired, whether for cultivation or  
grazing, will bring all desired infor-  
mation, with plat of the lands now  
being distributed. A two cent post-  
e stamp takes a letter to Mexico.

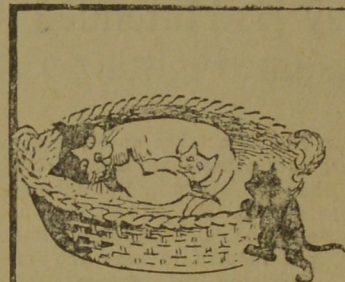

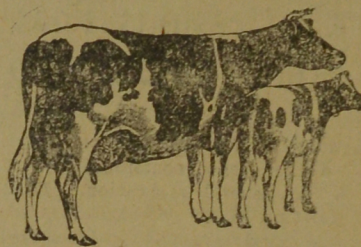
