Pttawa, June 3-The senate today amended one government bill and gave a third reading to several others. The branch line bill under which the minister of railways has authority to acquire branches for the government railway system was the first neasure taken up.

There was a protest against provision allowing the minister to lease a line up to a length of 200 miles without obtaining special authority from parliament.

port of May 29 says:
"The expansion of trade in wholesale lines has not developed to any extent during the week. The heavy stocks of fall and winter goods that have been carried over by retailers from last year, has caused a dearth of fall orders, business being made up principally of sorting orders, and not many of these came to hand. The scarcity of money is still felt all over the country, especially in real estate and building circles. Some of our large buildings have had to remain unfinished for this season, and some large rates of interest have been paid for some big temporary loans for short periods, while others have been unable to get loans on real estate investments in some of outlying districts, and the prevailing opinion is that money today is as tight as it has been at any time during this year, and there seems to be no hopeful outlook at present that it


