**SERIOUS CHARGE
AGAINST A PASTOR**

Plainfield, N.J., June 5—Rev. W. L. S. MacRorie, formerly pastor of a Methodist church at St. Horeb, was arraigned in court today for trial on an indictment recently returned against him on charges made by a young woman who was a member of his congregation. Rev. Mr. MacRorie was first arrested on November 22nd of last year as a result of a complaint made by Mrs. Amelia Mason, mother of nineteen-year-old Gertrude Mason, a singer in the St. Horeb church. The pastor admitted at that time that he had taken the young woman on numerous automobile rides but blamed his arrest to the influence of liquor dealers against whom he had been active.

The grand jury at that time failed to indict the accused minister, but charges made by two other ministers became a matter for consideration at the Newark conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Newark last March by a special committee. Mr. MacRorie had resigned his pastorate in the meantime. The conference committee that probed the case reported to the conference that the charges were not sustained. Notwithstanding the finding of the committee the grand jury again took the matter up, with the result that the former minister was indicted and must stand trial on the serious charges made by the young woman in the case.

**FORGED TICKETS USED
AT LAURIER MEETING**

Toronto, June 4—"That knowing certain documents, to wit certain tickets purporting to entitle the holders thereof and confer on them the right to attend and be present at a certain meeting to be held on the evening of May 5, 1913, at the Arena on Mutual street, in the City of Toronto, to be forged, did use, deal with, act upon and cause or attempt to cause other persons to use, deal with or act upon the same as if they were genuine."

This is the charge that was laid this morning against R. G. Leaman and William Crawford in connection with forged tickets used at the Laurier meeting a month ago.

The complainant is W. F. Summer Hayes and this morning he swore to the information before Magistrate Denison. The summonses are returnable on Tuesday next at ten o'clock in the police court.

These informations are the result of enquiry made by the Liberals to find out who was responsible for the printing of the tickets of which several thousand were handed round. The signature of F. G. Inwood was reproduced on the forged tickets.

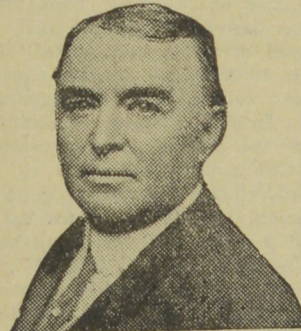

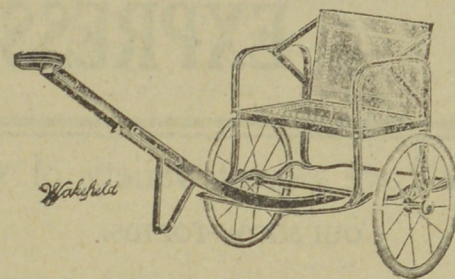
