LIBERALS HOLD TWO QUEBEC SEATS

Quebec, June 2—After one of the hardest political contests that has taken place in the county for years, Dorchester remains in the Liberal column of the provincial legislature. For over a week both parties made most strenuous efforts to carry the seat. They sent some of their best speakers into the constituency, while canvassers were used in every direction, visiting people who did not attend meetings.

Cannon, Liberal candidate, has 147 majority over Dussault, Conservative.

Quebec, June 2—Sir Lomer Gouin said tonight that the majority for Mr. Trahan, the Liberal candidate in Nicolet was between eight and nine hundred votes. Notary Rheault opposed him as Independent-Liberal.

The vacancy was caused by the decision of Hon. Chas. Devlin, men of colonization to sit for Temiskaming.

LIBERALS LEADING IN AUSTRALIA

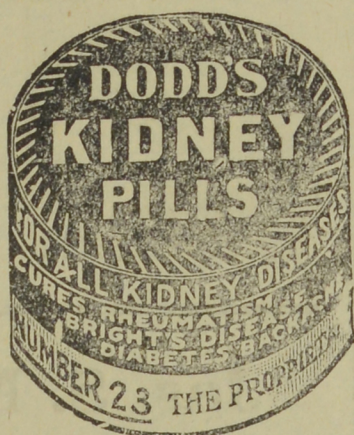
Melbourne, June 2—The returns from the federal elections held Saturday, while still incomplete, are sufficiently full to indicate the probable defeat of the ministerialists. The returns up to date show that for the house of representatives thirty-seven Liberals have been elected and thirty-five Laborites, three seats being doubtful. The Liberals scored heavily in the rural districts, while the metropolitan districts polled strongly in favor of the Labor party.

The senate will remain in control of the Labor party, leading to a deadlock in legislation, as four months will elapse before another election is held.

Boston, Mass., May 30—Hundreds of trained college athletes gathered in the Harvard stadium today for the preliminary events in the thirty-seventh annual track and field meet of the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America. The survivors of today's contests will compete for the championships tomorrow.

Seldom in the history of the intercollegiate championships has there been such a wealth of runners, leapers and weight hurlers of high grade as are included in the entries this year. It seems almost certain that some of the marks in the various events will be displaced by better figures and that Pennsylvania, which won the championship last year, will have to fight hard to retain the title.

Harvard, Cornell, Yale, Princeton, Dartmouth and a host of the smaller Eastern colleges are represented by their star performers. Michigan has sent a team to the meet and the far West is represented for the first time by a team from the University of California. Several athletes of championship calibre are included among the Californians and the prediction is made that they will figure prominently in the fight for the titles.

Central Kingsclear, May 29—A Finlander working on the St. John and Quebec Railway at Central Kingsclear was seriously injured by an explosion of dynamite caps which were placed in an old stove which was used to thaw dynamite. The stove was blown to pieces and quite a number of fragments were taken out of the man's face by Dr. Robertson who was called to dress his wounds. If it had not been for the brave deed of Franky Goodine who was working with the Finlander he would have been blown to pieces by the dynamite which exploded shortly after the man had been taken from the building by Goodine. The building was blown to atoms the sleepers of which it was built were blown so far in the air they looked like tooth-picks.

Today the injured man is suffering considerably with his head. Dr. B. M. Mullen was sent for but would not come so Dr. Robertson was called again.
