ABSENT JURYMEN

ORDERED FINED BY
COUNTY COURT JUDGE

Heavy Docket for York County Court
---Four Criminal Cases---Five Applications for Naturalization---
Adjourned Till Tomorrow

The York County Court met this morning pursuant to adjournment but there was very little business transacted. Judge Wilson presided and the bar was represented by Messrs. J. L. March and Phinney, K. C's., R. B. Hanson, P. A. Guthrie, J. W. McCready, P. Hughes, R. B. Hanson and J. T. Sharkey. Mr. T. C. L. Ketchum of Woodstock was present on his capacity of official stenographer.

Out of twenty-four grand jurors summoned seventeen answered to their names and His Honor ordered a fine of twelve dollars to be imposed upon those who were absent and had not been excused.

The grand jury elected Mr. C. A. Sampson foreman and after being sworn were dismissed by His Honor until tomorrow morning at ten o'clock.

The docket includes four criminal cases the defendants being Russian railway navies who are charged with raising checks drawn on the Royal Bank of Canada. Contrary to the usual custom the accused are to be defended by Mr. P. A. Guthrie, Clerk of the court while Mr. R. B. Hanson has been retained to conduct the case on behalf of the Attorney General. There seems to have been delay in preparing the depositions and in subpoenaing witnesses with the result that the Crown was unable to proceed with the case this morning. The evidence will have to be taken by means of an interpreter and at last accounts one had not been secured by the Crown.

Scott, another member of the Fire Committee, is also out of the city and of the committee Ald. Osborne, Ald. Farrell and Ald. Rogers were present at last night's meeting of the City Council. Mr. McCarthy came from St. John last evening to meet the Fire Committee with a view toward making an offer of sale to the city of the lot adjoining the site of the present Central Fire Station. Mr. McCarthy is oldest member of the family of late J. E. McCarthy, whose
