

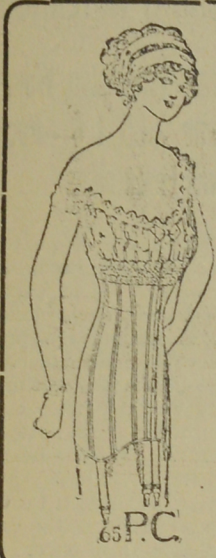

**MATERNITY DEPARTMENT.**

The president said he received a  
letter from Mrs. W. T. Whitehead, at  
present in Victoria, B.C., asking that  
in providing for a new building a  
couple of thousand dollars should be  
added for a maternity department.

She says the Ladies' Committee has  
\$1000 or more in the bank awaiting  
the action of the trustees.

Architect Brodie being in the city,  
visited the hospital and met the trust-  
ees. He explained some blue prints  
he had prepared and gave the trust-  
ees much valuable information.

Upon the suggestion of the chair-  
man, Ald. Farrell was added to the  
Building Committee and the opinion  
was generally expressed that four  
rooms should be allotted in the new  
building for a maternity branch of  
hospital work.

The Local Improvement Society  
having improved the grounds about  
the hospital and placed them in such  
attractive condition, the mayor and  
Mr. VanDine were appointed a com-  
mittee to have the lawn properly  
trimmed and the grass cut at all  
times.

**TO PROVIDE MEANS.**

The Building Committee was asked  
to complete preliminary work for  
undertaking the erection of the new  
building by at once providing ways  
and means. It is believed the pro-  
posed new building will cost twelve  
thousand dollars.

On motion of Ald. Farrell the sec-  
retary will take steps to protect some  
parts of the X-Ray plant from injury.  
After passing a number of accounts  
the meeting adjourned.
