LIQUOR BEING
SOLD ILLEGALLY
OUTSIDE CITY

Mayor Hooper Says Many Drunks Come from Kingsclear—State-ments by Others that Liquor is Sold to Railway Laborers

At last night's meeting of the City Council in committee, His Worship the Mayor commented on the fact that from his personal observation he had learned that there were more drunken men to be seen in the West End than in the eastern part of the city and that they were largely foreign laborers off railroad construction. He had been informed by citizens that men could be seen coming in the main road from Kingsclear in various conditions of intoxication and that the natural inference was that liquor was being sold in considerable quantities in the Parish of Kingsclear and the men buying and drinking it were coming into the city.

Similar statements to those of His Worship have been made by others and the city police are of the opinion that the laborers are getting the liquor on the construction work or near to it. There are stories to the effect that peddlers' carts are used to convey whiskey to the different camps and that a large quantity of liquor is sold in that manner.

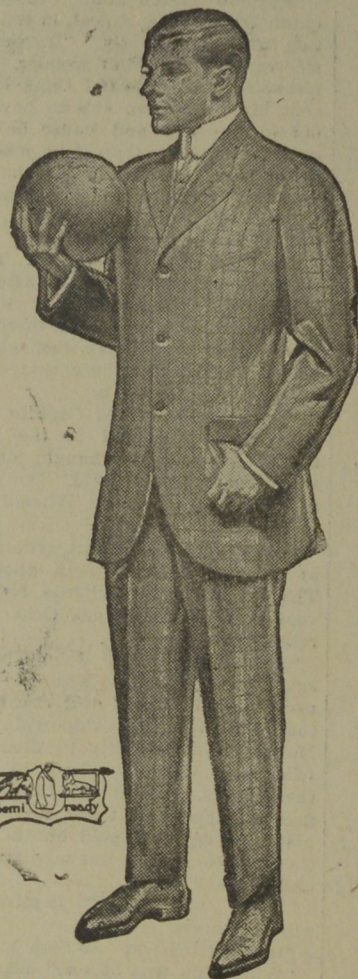
