

Ordinarily at this eeason of the year the machinery of government slows down almost to a standstill. But with Congress in session and the President, cabinet members and heads of departments on the job the Washingtonian might mistake the season for mid-winter-were it not for the extreme heat.

The hot weather of the past few weeks has imbued the powers with a strong desire to get away on their vacations before vacation time is en tirely ended, and in consequence it is likely that the congressional mill will be speeded up from now on During the coming week the senatorial debates on the tariff measare will begin in earnest, while the cess program of the House is likely to be ended with the bringing in o
