pany, we understand, is making an
excellent showing as regards earn-
ings.

MONEY

American advices say that business
in money is very tight. To quick
borrowers and those of high stand-
ing there is accommodation provided
but others find the money market
tight and the supply scarce. There
seems to be a disposition on the part
of borrowers to secure more money
than is absolutely necessary, so as
to strengthen their position.

The Bank of England statement
this week is remarkable for its
strength. Public and private deposits
show a very large reduction and se-
curities have been heavily decreased.
The proportion of reserve to liabilities,
however, has increased 8.45 per
cent. from last week, and is higher
than at the same time a year ago,
though the bank rate stands at 4 1/2
per cent. as opposed to 3 per cent.
at that time.

In Canada the banks continue to
curtail. As a general rule they are
losing deposits through the purchase
of high grade securities which are
now selling at very attractive prices
and reduction is necessary in order
to provide for full requirements,
which present conditions indicate will
be large.

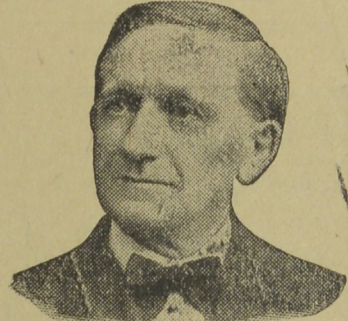

BELFAST ORANGE-
MEN CELEBRATE

Belfast, July 12—The societies of
Orangemen in Belfast and vicinity to-
day indulged in their customary big
celebration of the anniversary of the
battle of the Boyne in 1690, in which
the forces of James II. were defeated
by the Protestant army. Because of
the high feeling existing in Ulster
just now over the Home Rule bill the
authorities took extraordinary pre-
cautions to prevent any dis-
orderly demonstrations or street
riots such as frequently marked the
celebration of Orangemen's day in
former years.

STAMPAGE RATE BOOSTED
BY THE GOVERNMENT

The Local Government at its meet-
ing here this week decided on the
following increase in the rates of
stampage. Spruce from \$1.25 to \$1.50
hardwood from 80c. to \$1.25; hem-
lock from 40c. to \$1.00; fir from
80c. to \$1.20; railway ties from
21c to 5c. The bonus for saw mill
licenses have been fixed as follows:
Class A, \$100 per square mile, Class
B, \$75; Class C, \$50; Class D, \$20.
