STATEMENT BY CHURCHILL

London, April 1-In the debate the House of Commons today, Winston Churchill, First Lord of the Admiralty, made one noteworthy statement of no little importance to Canadians. He said:

"Canadian ships are absolutely necessary for the whole world defence of the British Empire from the end of 1915 or the incoming of 1916 onwards. The fact that they are neces sary is no measure of their value. We can build three ships ourselves, if necessary.

"It is the fact that this new great nation is coming forward with all its measureless strength and wide possibility to testify to the enduring life of the British Empire which has already produced an impression throughout the world.

"This is of more value than many Dreadnought ships, the impression which conduces both to the safety of this country and the peace of the
