(Continued from page one) er box at druggists and storekeep- more lavish offices in New York and The New York office proved unprofitable, and the paper was discontinued after it had been run for several months at an expense estimated at half a million dollars.

Early in 1908 King's customers began to complain that listed stocks for which they had sent him money had not been delivered. A little later it was announced that King had placed all his property and affairs in the hands of two trustees. A meeting of creditors followed, King was declared a bankrupt, and an investi Mr. Walter L. Damon, who has been gation by the trustees in bankruptcy

King was traced to Paris and fin leave in a few days for his former ally to Colombo, Ceylon. He return home in Massachussetts. Mr. Damon ed to Boston and surrendered him self at police headquarters June 12 1908. His trial began on Dec. 4 and on Dec. 29 he was convicted on 27 of 31 counts, charging larceny and embezzlement.

Two weeks after his conviction, King was sentenced by Judge Scho field to hard labor in the State prison. The sentence followed a most dramatic recital in which King reviewed his life, his flight from Boston and his travels in Europe and Asia. He declared that he was innocent of any wrong intent in any of his acts, and he closed by accusing Thomas W. Lawton, the Boston financier, of secretly fighting him and bringing him to financial ruin. Later he made repeated attempts to taio a pardon.
