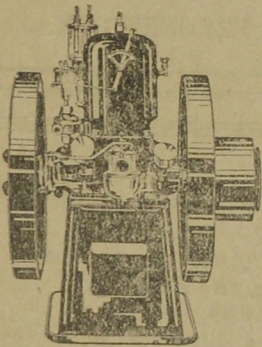

Great Exhibition of Ball at Scully's Grove Yesterday--Score was 4 to 4--Ganley, Marcotte and Jacobson Showed Some Extra Fine Fielding--Bob Conley to Join Fredericton Team

St. Croix got away last evening with the big end of the series with Fredericton winning one game and tying yesterday 4 to 4 after ten innings of first class baseball. The game will have to be played over again so that the change made in the schedule by bringing the St. Stephen-Calais team here for a game Wednesday has not advanced the season any.

Yesterday's game should have satisfied the most fastidious fan. The two teams battled throughout the ten innings with first one and then the other leading until the sixth inning when the game was tied. An arrangement had been made to call the game at 5.15 to enable St. Croix to catch a train. Otherwise the game might have continued indefinitely as both teams were playing sharply.

Ahearn the Pets' southpaw started the game St. Croix began to find him and in the fourth after he had been found for five hits Ganley took him out and sent Condon in "Pete" was equal to the occasion and in the rest of the game was touched for just three bingles. His pitching was one of the features of the game. "Dutch" Howard did the pitching for Calais-St. Stephen. Fredericton got him for nine safe ones of which Frank Flynn furnished three singles and Condon a two-bagger and a three bagger. Howard does not appear to be so much of a mystery as he was.

FINE FIELDING

There were also some A1 fielding stunts. Robert S. Ganley pulled off one in the second when Gross propelled a long fly toward the Regent Street entrance for what looked like a home-run. Bob ran back and made a leap in the air and a left-hand stab. The ball stuck right in his mit and the crowd gave him a great hand. In the seventh a foul off Lynch's bat went into the crowd back of third base. Marcotte went after it like a shot plunging among the spectators and getting the ball as he made a final jump. In right field Bert White also made a couple of difficult catches. For St. Croix, Jacobson pulled off a piece of work in the second inning that it seldom seen here. Ahearn drove the ball to right field for what looked like a sure single but Jacobson whipped it into first base in time to get him.

GAME IN DETAIL

NINE CLASS RACES FOR EXHIBITION WEEK

Fredericton Park Association Declares Midsummer Meet and Exhibition Stakes off--Failed to Fill--Four Day's Racing, Sept. 15, 16, 17 and 18 Substituted--Enteries Close August 18

The executive of the Fredericton Park Association met at the Barker House last night and opened entries for the meetings which it had been proposed to hold. Both the midsummer meet, which was proposed to be held June 30 and July 1, was declared off by the executive and the

In the last half of the first inning, Fredericton took the lead, scoring twice. Fryer struck out, but Ganley was safe on Tetrault's error. He stole second, and scored on a hit by F. Flynn, Duggan was safe on an error and went to third on that hit and stole home.

St. Croix scored two in the third, making the score 3 to 2. Parker led off with a three-bagger to right field, Lynch followed and was passed, he stole second. McPherson and Tetrault went out in short order, but Pease brought in two runs with a nice single.

In the sixth St. Croix made it 4 to 2, Vance scoring, being passed and completing the circuit on singles by Gross and Howard.

In the last of the eighth Fredericton scored another making the tally 4 to 3. Duggan hit safely and stole second. White sacrificed him to third, and he scored on F. Flynn's base hit. Flynn reached third on the catcher's error, a bad throw to second, but died there. In the seventh Fredericton tied the game. Murphy made the run, hitting safely and stealing second. Condon sacrificed him to third, and Manager Ganley brought him home with a single.

For the balance of the game St. Croix went out in 1, 2, 3 order, except in the tenth inning, when Tetrault hit safely. Fredericton tried hard to win, but St. Croix tightened up at all critical times. In the eighth F. Flynn hit safely, but was caught stealing second, spoiling the chances in that inning. In the ninth, Marcotte made a bad bing, being called out for being hit by a batted ball. With two out Condon drove a three-base hit to right field. The crowd called on Pryor to win the game, but he hit to shortstop and was thrown out.

The tenth inning was almost a repetition of the ninth. With two out, White hit a three-bagger. F. Flynn went to bat but Dutch Howard took a brace and struck him out, ending the best game of the year.

The executive decided however, to substitute for the exhibition stakes nine classes which are expected to furnish four days' racing during exhibition week, Sept. 15 to 20. The intention is to have two classes on each day but the last, when there are to be three classes and a free-for-all. The classes are given above.

Conditions in horse-racing circles all over New Brunswick and Maine appear to be worse this summer than they have been for several years. As a result several meets have been declared off. Few American horses are to come to the Maritime Provinces this season except from the Aroostook Valley, which probably will send a few. It is a matter for regret that the local track association has met with the difficulties it has, but there still is prospect of good racing during the exhibition. Entries for the exhibition classes close August 18.

BANGOR BLEW UP IN TENTH INNING ST. JOHN WON 10 TO 4

Nine Innings of Good Baseball at Bangor Followed by Slaughter--Gerard in Bad Shape

Bangor, Me., June 19—After playing gilt-edge ball for nine innings, at the end of which the score was two each, the game here today between St. John and Bangor degenerated into the veriest kind of a farce, the visitors accumulating eight runs in the tenth inning and perhaps would have made more except for their anxiety to make a train, the last runner being put out while walking to second.

Bangor got into the game in the second inning, when Tewhey reached second, Woodbury dropping his fly and scored on Wildes' fly to Black. The visitors tied the score in the seventh, Pinkerton reaching first on Wildes' fumble and, after being sacrificed along by Black, scored when Hammond failed to stop Watts' long hit to right. Bangor came back with a run in the same inning. Brooks banded a two-bagger and scored on Swazey's hit. In the ninth the visitors tied it up. Black scored an earned run, getting a single and being brought home by Watt's two-bagger.

Although McLellan was pitching fine ball, Manager Magoon withdrew him at this time and Girard went into the box. The tenth opened up. O'Brien was safe when Girard on the throw to first hit him on the head, the ball going to right field. Girard kept up his horrible exhibition by hitting Tarbell with a pitched ball and O'Brien scored on a wild pitch. Then the batting fast began. Black singled, Shankey tripled. Watt was out. Bien was safe on an error. He stole second. Waterhouse singled. Riley hit for four sacks. Woodbury was safe on Lamorey's bad throw to first. He was out at third on an attempt to steal.
