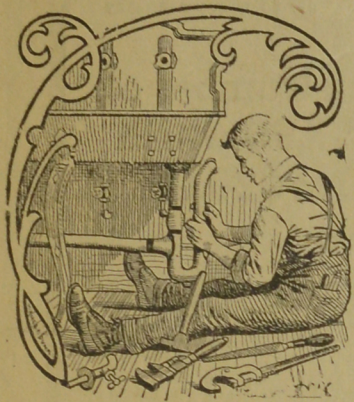

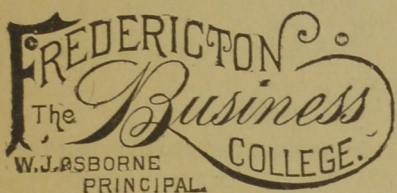

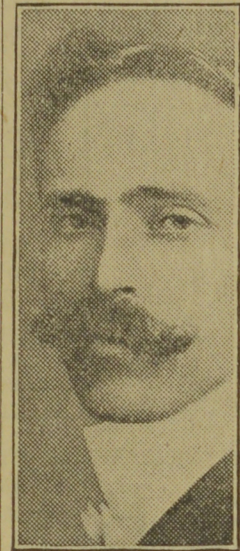

## PROTESTS FROM MAINE AGAINST TARIFF

Washington, D. C., June 18—Peti-  
tions from the State of Maine, pro-  
testing against Canadian competitor  
in potatoes, print paper and pulp  
reached the senate today, and were  
read before the Senate Finance Com-  
mittee which is hard at work en-  
deavoring to get the Tariff Bill in  
shape to report to the Senate with  
in seven days.

The petitions were signed mostly by  
working men engaged in the paper  
and potato industries. They stated  
that inasmuch as nearly everything  
Maine produces or manufactures has  
been placed on the free list (the  
Maine workmen will face a long pe-  
riod of idleness.

This is but a single instance of the  
theory that the Tariff is a local issue.  
Unhappily Democrats are willing to  
accept free trade on everything ex-  
cept the articles produced in their  
own community. The consistent Dem-  
ocrats, on the other hand, are anx-  
ious to have the benefit of the vast  
resources of Canada, in order to  
keep down the increasing cost of liv-  
ing in the United States.

It was announced this morning  
that wheat and flour would remain  
positively on the free list, with a  
counter-vailing duty, despite publica-  
tions to the contrary. It is not de-  
cided whether a counter-vailing duty  
will be placed on cattle and meats,  
which are also to be free.

The Senate has high hopes of put-  
ting through a Tariff Bill with cer-  
tain changes will render it a different  
document from the one which went to  
the Senate from the House. Cana-  
dian articles are in the main unaf-  
fected, although the tendency is to en-  
large the free list but the House is  
very jealous of its jurisdiction over  
tariff matters, and these will be a  
fine tussle when the two bodies has  
to get down to business, and try to  
get each other to relinquish certain  
pet projects.

It was predicted today by Robert  
Henry, of Texas, one of the Byran  
Democrats of the House, and a leader,  
that Congress would be busy on  
the tariff until Oct. 1.

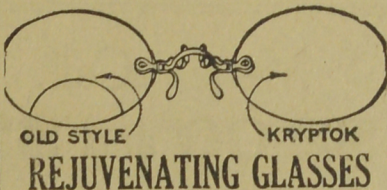
