outside rooms. They will be comfortable and suitably furnished, each room having a dressing table and a commodious wardrobe. These rooms are lighted by rectangular windows which can be opened or shut at will. Another feature that will be appreciated by passengers is that the basins will be fitted with running water.

On the ship there is a great deal of space on both the A and B Decks and passengers will have the choice of an open or covered promenade, according to their desire.

The Third-class accommodation has been designed to give the passengers the best possible accommodation at very moderate prices. There is a Ladies' Room, two Smoking Rooms, and a large General Room where concerts can be held. All Third-Class passengers are berthed in Cabins, of which there is a considerable number for two persons. The majority, however, will accommodate four or six passengers, the latter being intended for families and parties. The space reserved for Third-Class passengers is both roomy and well placed, and as there are both open and covered promenades, Third-Class passengers will be able to enjoy the beauties of the bracing ocean air under the most pleasant conditions.

### SIR WILFRID LAURIER'S NAVAL RESOLUTION

Ottawa, Ont., March 25—Sir Wilfrid Laurier's naval amendment is as follows:

That all the words after the word "after" be struck out, and the following substituted therefor:

This House declines to concur in the said resolution and orders that the same be referred back to the committee with instructions to amend the same in the following particulars, namely to strike out all words after clause A and substitute therefor the following:

The memorandum prepared by the Board of Admiralty on the general naval situation of the empire and communicated to this House by the Rt. Hon. the Prime Minister on December 5, shows that several of the most important of the foreign powers have adopted a definite policy of rapidly increasing their naval strength.

That this condition has compelled the United Kingdom to concentrate its naval forces in home waters, involving the withdrawal of ships from the outlying portions of the empire;

That such withdrawal renders it necessary that Canada, WITHOUT FURTHER DELAY, SHOULD ENTER ACTIVELY UPON A PERMANENT POLICY OF NAVAL DEFENCE

That any measure of Canadian aid to imperial naval defence which does not embody a permanent policy of participation by ships OWNED, MANNED AND MAINTAINED BY CANADA, AND CONTEMPLATING CONSTRUCTION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE IN CANADA, IS NOT AN ADEQUATE OR SATISFACTORY EXPRESSION OF THE ASPIRATIONS OF THE CANADIAN PEOPLE IN REGARD TO NAVAL DEFENCE, AND IS NOT AN ASSUMPTION BY CANADA OF HER FAIR SHARE IN THE MAINTENANCE OF THE NAVAL STRENGTH OF THE EMPIRE.

happier and Premier Borden won't have to come to his defence so often. is a great deal in what the Hon. Charles Murphy says. Ill-considered letters tend to diminish our respect for British public men and take away the enchantment that distance lends. When a British Cabinet Minister thinks of writing a letter to any of the overseas dominions it is a good rule to pause and count a hundred before he does it. The chances are then that he won't do it at all. This forbearance is much better than crowding the North Sea with so many Dreadnoughts that they will trip over each other.

#### THE OLD NAVY DEBATE

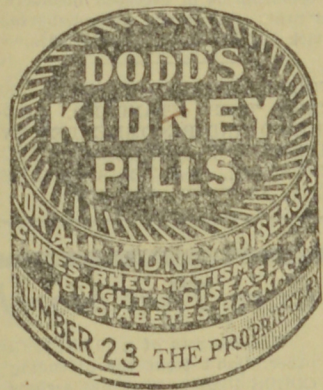
Meanwhile the debate jogs on and much two-o'clock-in-the-morning courage is shown in making speeches which tell how far we have strayed from the spirit of the Fathers of Confederation. By the way, I looked up the navy debate of 1865 and found there this debate all over again—emergency, secret documents, confidential letters, the same old bag of tricks. Which goes to prove what the Hon. Charles Murphy contends, that this naval contribution not only halts the march of home rule, but actually retraces our steps. At this moment we are as far on the back road as in 1865.

The debate shows no signs of ending before the Easter holidays, to which holidays the Government is looking forward to as a truce of God. It seemed for a while that the Government might come out of its trance long enough to answer the Coderre charges but there is no chance of reaching them for five days, that time being all too short for Mr. Coderre to file affidavits and otherwise get his torpedo nets out. No election says the Government. The Borden luck of 1911 is not to be flouted by trying it again in 1913. A change of luck is the last thing the outfit of stand-patters wants. So far the debate has not jarred the Government loose but it has served a good purpose in letting England know just how spontaneous the gift is, not to mention making it impossible for any Canadian Government in its senses to contemplate a permanent policy of three Dreadnoughts a year.
