The popular conception of the disposal of the remains of Columbus. which is supported by the best authorities, is that the remains of Columbus and his son were originally interred at Seville, and removed to the cathedral at Santo Domingo in 1542 and removed to the cathedral at Havana, Cuba, in 1795. In 1898, following the Spanish-American war, the remains were supposed to have been sent to Seville again.
