## MARRIAGE LAW TO PRIVY COUNCIL

Montreal, July 28—Before the close of the present year, the privy council will have entered into deliberation in the matter of the Quebec marriage laws. This information was conveyed in a cablegram received by Arnold Wainwright during the week-end, announcing that special leave to appeal had been granted in the Tremblay-Depatie case.

The news of the granting of special leave, is significant as it is now practically assured that both sides will be represented before the empire's highest tribunal. It will be recalled that in the Tremblay case the parties were married before their cure. They subsequently found that they were cousins. Such relationship, in the absence of a dispensation, constitutes a canonical nullity. The husband availed himself of this nullity to have the union canonically dissolved, the wife contesting.

## STRIKE

will see that the men's request was hardly sufficient to meet the living increase. The management kept fooling and putting the men off from time to time until the week before last. Then General Manager Gutelius set Thursday July 17, as a day for a conference. The men sent a large committee to Moncton from different parts of the country at considerable expense. Through failure of the General Manager to meet the men at the appointed time they were compelled to wait until Saturday. After the initial meeting instead of having the conferences of reasonable length they were shortened, compelling the men to remain the week.

"We had anticipated, after the public announcement of Mr. Gutelius, particularly before the Halifax Board of Trade, that he was willing to deal fairly with employees. In many respects his offers were nothing less than ridiculous. Except in one or two cases General Manager Gutelius wanted to give less than 6 per cent. let alone 12 per cent. and wanted to take away some of the privileges they now enjoy, just the same as he took away from the trainmen. It is only of recent date that train conductors were put back to brakemen and other unfair changes made. In many cases that were particularly deserving, he offered less than nothing.

"We did everything possible to meet the management in fixing up the rules, anticipating that they would meet the men on the wage question. They had expected Gutelius would be more liberal as he had made promises to that effect.

"The dead-lock came on the matter of ruling out five hundred members of the organization. This was on Saturday after a week's delay at Moncton, and because of the refusal of the men to agree to that request, all the agreements which during the week's previous conferences had been arrived at were rescinded, and matters stand precisely where they were at the beginning.

### CAUSED ANNOYANCE.

Residents of University Avenue are complaining of being disturbed last night by the bellowing of calves consigned to local people which were allowed to remain in the I.R.C. yards unattended.

### CASE POSTPONED.

The Canada Temperance Act case against Charles O'Ree, which was to be before the police court this morning, was postponed until Thursday, no person appearing.

### COAL COMMANDERED.

Chatham World.—The Intercolonial has the legal right to appropriate coal that it may be hauling as freight to its own use, but it should surely notify the owners when it takes their property. It took a carload some time ago, belonging to the Mitisnichi Foundry, and it was not for several days and until inquiries had been made that the owner learned its fate. If notice had been sent by the officials who appropriated the coal, its owner could have ordered another supply at once. Now he is buying coal here in town to supply his immediate needs. General Manager Gutelius should look into this.

### ANKLE SEVERELY INJURED.

R. B. Smith of Oromocto, the well known lumberman, had an ankle severely hurt yesterday while he was alighting from his automobile. Mr. Smith was stepping off the running-board before the car had quite come to a standstill. He slipped and one foot went under the car, the wheel passing over it. This afternoon Dr. Atherton was called in consultation with Dr. Peake, as it is feared that the ankle is broken.
