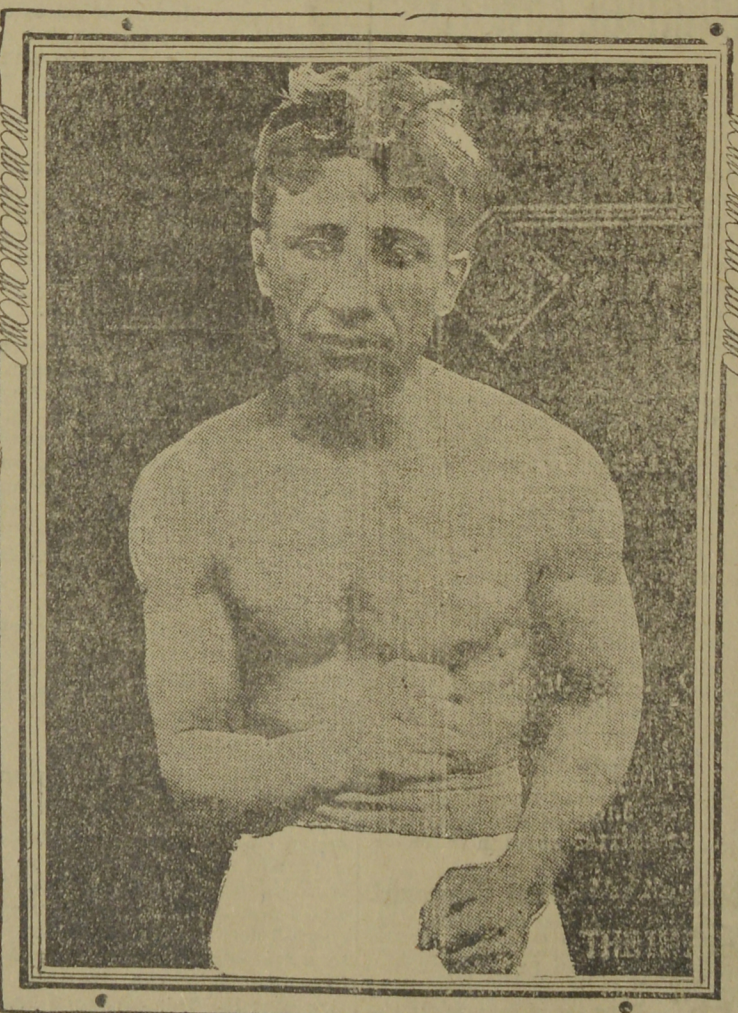

Bangor, Me., July 28--In a fast and snappy game here today Fredericton went down to defeat by the score of 7 to 1. The visitors were unable to hit Wallace who pitched masterly ball, allowing only four hits. Bangor landed on Morey for fourteen safe singles including three triples and a home run.

Reed opened the game with a triple and scored when Connaughton put one in the same place for three more sacks. After Boardman grounded out to Keane, Matthews singled scoring Connaughton.

Fredericton scored its only run of the game in the second. After two men had fled out, Condon singled scoring Conley. When Morey singled Condon tried for home, but was caught at the plate. After this there was nothing to it and but two men saw second.

In Bangor's half of the second, Dolan tripled and scored on a single by Wakefield. With two down in the fifth Matthews hit a line drive to left centre for four sacks. After the second inning Wallace allowed but two hits. In the fifth Condon singled but died on first. Keane got a safe hit in the ninth to left, but the following three men fled to the outfield. ## TWO RECORDS BROKEN MONDAY AT GRAND RAPIDS

Uhlen with "D.C." Tanner Driving Lowered all Michigan Marks--Longworth B. Beat Season Records.

Grand Rapids, Mich., July 28--Before a great crowd and with ideal weather conditions prevailing, the inauguration today of Grand Rapids' third annual grand circuit race meeting was featured by the breaking of two records.

Foremost interest of these was the lowering by Uhlan, driven by Trainer Doc Tanner, of all marks for Michigan tracks. Billings' great black gelding was started to lower the Comstock track trotting record of 2:06½, established by Dudie Archdale two years ago. He not only did this with ease, but also bettered by three seconds the state record of 2:02½, stepped by Hamburg Belle at Detroit four years ago, Uhlan's time being 1:59½.

In the third and deciding heat of the 2:05 pace, the Giffline stake, Longworth B. lowered the season's race record to 2:02½. Longworth B. took this event in straight heats.

The 2:18 trot was a regular horse race and brought to light two new 2:10 trotters in Crescote, winner of the first heat, in 2:09½, and Grand Marshal, winner of three subsequent heats, all in 2:08 and a fraction. Geers' Reusens challenged strong in not reach the finish.
