New York, N.Y., Feb. 6.—The current news budget contributes nothing new or more than of passing interest to the financial community and the stock market continues to be a waiting affair. The foreign markets seem to reflect a confidence in the early cessation of the Balkan war, but the knowledge that there will be an active competitive demand for money from the various states now involved in the difficulty serves to temper optimism. Here the expectation of legislation agitation in various forms exerts the same effect. Until something new develops to influence large interests, the market appears to have reached an equitable level and for the immediate future the movements of prices are likely to be narrow of range and controlled largely by technical conditions.

## NEW S. S. SERVICE INAUGURATED

Berlin, Feb. 5.—The departure of the steamship *Sidon* from Hamburg to-burg today for the far East, by way of the Suez Canal, is preliminary to the extension of the East Asiatic service of the Hamburg-American line across the Pacific to Tacoma, Seattle and Vancouver. By this service the Hamburg-American Company will become the first to completely circumnavigate the globe with two regular services, whose termini are Tacoma and Hamburg. Its *Kosmos* line has for years operated between Hamburg and Tacoma, crossing the Atlantic to South America thence through the Straits of Magellan and up the western coast to Puget Sound. The latter service will be continued unchanged after the Panama Canal opens.

## BEGINNING OF THE LENTEN SEASON

Washington, D.C., Feb. 5.—Today, Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of the Lenten season. The annual fast of forty days observed from very early in the times in the Christian Church, in commemoration of Christ's forty days' fast, continues until Easter, for which feast the fast serves also as a season of special penitence and preparation. Easter this year falls on March 23 which is the earliest date that it can possibly come in any year. The day is regulated by the Zodiac. Days and nights are of equal length on the 21st of March and the first Sunday after the first full moon, after the days and nights are of equal length, is always Easter.

## THE WAR

surrendered Adrianople, but was precipitated by some mistake. Hence the difficulty the ministry is now in. "There is not a cent in the treasury, and there is no means of getting money until peace is concluded and, meanwhile, the country is drifting to ruin and bankruptcy. A great anti-war demonstration occurred Sunday in front of the war office at which the young Turks were publicly denounced as murderers and thieves. Mamoud Schelket Pasha appeared on the balcony and tried to make a speech, but was greeted with opprobrious epithets.

### DISEASE RAMPANT

"The misery in the Turkish camps is indescribable. It has been bitterly cold with a heavy snow, the soldiers were ill-fed and badly sheltered. Smallpox, enteric fever, dysentery and pneumonia have replaced Asiatic cholera.

"It is understood that the forces at Tchatalia, have been reduced to 120,000, which is considered ample to defend the lines. Large reinforcements have been sent to Gallipoli, where there are now 70,000 men. There is talk of landing a force in the neighborhood of Rodosto to outflank the Bulgarians, but such a scheme is impracticable. In the present state of the Turkish organization the army would starve the moment it attempted to leave the coast.

"From a military and economic standpoint Turkey's position is hopeless. Nothing can prevent even worse misfortunes except immediate acceptance of the inevitable."

### BULGARIAN ARMY IN FINE FETTER

Sofia, Feb. —General Savoff, commander of the Bulgarian forces has addressed an order to the army declaring that the Turks' object throughout the negotiations was merely to gain time, but that the Bulgarians utilized that time to far greater advantage.

"We are now entirely ready in a better state of preparedness than before the declaration of war," says the general, "and in order to break the enemy's resistance finally we shall have to overthrow him once more and scatter his hastily mustered and untrained hordes. We must hurl him to the ground and there on the battlefield dictate terms of peace. The Turks must be driven beyond the seas."
