On Wednesday the team goes to St. John and on Thursday St. John will play here. Friday and Saturday Fredericton plays at St. John. The four-game series with the Marathons will pretty well decide whether Fredericton or St. John will win the league. Some double-headers may be worked in this week.

Pitcher Phelan is a six-footer, weighing 195 pounds. He has been pitching for semi-pro. teams in and about Greater New York and early in the season was with the Brooklyn Nationals. He has a good record. "Lefty" Ahearn, who was released by Fredericton on Friday last, was signed by Bangor Saturday. He probably will pitch against St. John today.

GREAT GAME AT BANGOR.

Bangor, Aug. 10--Fredericton defeated Bangor in a fast and exciting game Saturday, the score being 6 to 5. Both teams played fast and snappy ball. The features of the game were the fielding of Ganley for Fredericton and that of Tewhey for the home team.

Ganley saved the game for Fredericton in the seventh when, after a long fast run, he speared a long-hitter, by Matthews, with one hand.

Tewhey was back in his old time form, accepting nine chances without an error. In the eighth he assisted in putting three men out, also figuring in two double plays.
