"Two years ago last September when the Eucharistic Congress met at Montreal, a good deal of discus-sion took place in the press and else-where as to the presence of His Sunday afternoon, the last day of the Congress, when the Host was carried through the streets. It was held that the held that the regiments parading were there as an escort, and it was felt by many that this was wrong. Among others, the Canadian Baptist protested at the same time, calling attention to the fact that this same thing occurs every year at the "Corpus Christi" processions in the same city. We expressed strongly the view that this use of our troops should cease

"Since that time we have had change of government, but we still hold the same view on this matter. The Minister of Militia is now an Orangeman, and if there was any force in the Orange protest against what was done with the troops in Montreal two years ago last September, there is equal force a sinst what happened in Montreal on May 25th of this year, when the annual "Corpus Christi" procession took place. The Sixty-fifth Regiment on that day paraded to the number of about five hundred, and the men wore side arms and carried rifles, and the officers carried swords. The Repository was taken to the steps of the local University and there the Sixty-fifth presented arms as the Host was elevated. Now this is the second time that this has happened Col. the Hon. Sam Hughes, Minister of Militia, although he has only to say the word and have it stopped. If the Orange protest against the use

was sincere, that same protest

should still be made. . "If Col. Hughes makes an Orange speech next Saturday as he did on the Twelfth of July last year, he will have a splendid opportunity to explain himself. Either what happened at Montreal on May 25th last perfectly proper—in which case what happened at the Eucharistic Congress was also perfectly proper; or what we have above described was improper, and in that case it should stopped at once. We are aware that the troops in Toronto go to church together and no principle is violated. That, however, is very different from their acting as an escort and presenting arms to the Host. However, olonel Hughes says that this is all right, we shall have to accept his ruling. In that case, however, the protest against the Eucharastic Congresss was improperly made, and the Catholics were perfectly right. "But it is an attitude like this that

makes it hard for some of us to defend the Orangemen against the charge that the Orange order is chiefly a political organization, and that when anything can be made to embarrass a Liberal Premier it is heartily welcomed, but if it will embarrass an Orange Minister of Militia, it is passed over in silence. For our part, we are against a wrong use of the Canadian troops to please the Roman Catholics, whatever political party is in power."

It is a matter which should have the serious attention of members of the Orange order in this section. Many of them voted Tory at the last election with the object of putting a stop to this thing.
