**BUILD 250 MILES OF ROAD IN A DAY**

Five thousand Michigan men, from nearly every walk of life, have recently set an example which may well be followed by the whole United States, by building 250 miles of excellent automobile road in a single day. And the women of the northeastern part of the state, through which the new highway runs, are entitled to much credit, too, for what their husbands, fathers, brothers and sweethearts labored at digging and plowing and grading, these women cooked meals that put new heart in the muscle-weary workers and made this most notable accomplishment possible.

As a result of the labors of these Michigan people there now is an unbroken line of graveled highway for over 250 miles, from Bay City to MacMackinaw City, where two days before there was mile after mile of corduroy road, sand holes and swamp lands.

Mayors of cities and towns, state officials, millionaire lumbermen and mill men stayed in the hot sun, hewing with picks and axes at corduroy road slabs, throwing stones, shoveling sand and gravel, leading plow horses or performing other of the innumerable tasks which form part of the work of road-building. In this picture you have an idea of the spirit which animates northeastern Michigan.

T. G. Dafeo, Mayor of Alpena, went without his breakfast that he might board the big American Underclung car to which, as leader of his "gang," he had been assigned for the day. William A. Comstock, regent of the University of Michigan, left his home at four o'clock in the morning. The Plethers, Gilchris, Richardsons, Johnsons, Churchills—all names which stand for millions in wealth and vastly more in prominence and prestige in northern Michigan—had family representation of at least one and in most cases more on the line. They sweated side by side with the lowliest farmers and laborers of the district.

They did what seemed well-nigh impossible in the big swamp in Pulaski township, Presque Isle County, just over the Alpena line. Corduroy which was laid a generation or more ago and had long been the terror of motorists has been removed or so completely covered with a foundation of stones and earth, gravelled on top, that it will never again jar the backbone of the good roads enthusiast.

The women ran out to meet you and you could hear the men singing and cheering from afar as you came upon Pulaska hill a little farther on, which was literally cut in two. It

was too big a job for one day, but it will be done in a few days more and then will be removed one of the worst obstacles of the road. The hill was high and steep. Many a motorist has called into requisition a team of horses to make this hill.

It is an impossibility to tell the story of the Huron highway in a single breath. It's too big. Nothing has yet been said of the women who walked over country roads, all the family horses being at work on the hill, to prepare meals for their men at noon time and serve them on monstrous tables or carry the food to them as they worked.

Old men who could hardly have lifted a shovel daddled at piles of gravel or led horses pulling plows. They had to take part in the enthusiasm of the day in some way. Little boys and little girls who couldn't talk plainly, some couldn't speak English at all, followed their daddles and big brothers with pills of water hanging against their shins. The water carriers were as numerous as the workers in some cases.


Men of northeastern Michigan that night plodded the way home and sank to contented repose on banks of high and low degrees, thoroughly satisfied with the accomplishment of what they had been dreaming for months and in some cases years.

The importance of this Michigan spirit to the automobile world cannot be magnified. It is the individual demonstration of the urge of progress which has scores of the biggest motor car manufacturers in the country to donate a share of their earnings to the fund for building a cross continent highway that will be unequalled even in Europe, the "home of good roads."

With a display of even a part of this spirit in other states, the country would soon be criss-crossed with a net work of highways that would bring unbounded joy to those fortunate enough to possess an automobile, increased prosperity to the "backbone of the nation," the farmer, and lower cost of living and better conditions to every citizen.—V. 
