Announcement Made That Steamer Victoria Has Been Secured to Bring Canadian Manufacturers From St. John--Entertainment

The party of manufacturers from Ontario and Quebec which was to have visited New Brunswick during the summer but postponed their visit is to arrive in Fredericton September 20 according to announcement. The party is to attend the annual meeting of the Canadian Manufacturers Association in Halifax in September. On their return they will visit various points in New Brunswick including St. John and from that city will take a trip by the river to Fredericton. The steamer Victoria will bring the party here from St. John.

In Fredericton the entertainment of the visitors will be provided by the Board of Trade. They will be taken about the city and environs in automobiles and will be shown Fredericton's advantages from the point of view of the manufacturer.
