ITALY MAY RETURN CHARLTON AS INSANE

Rome, June 21.—It is probable that on the arrival of Porter Charlton, the young American who killed his wife and threw her body into Lake Como three years ago will be examined by medical experts. If they declare him to be insane he can easily be sent to America and placed in an asylum there. The Italian government will probably readily consent to this, as it is said that there are now 50,000 insane Italians in American asylums, as compared with 100 American citizens in Italian institutions. The question as to whether or not the Italian Government should pay for the difference in number between the Italians in American institutions and the Americans in Italian insane asylums has been in abeyance for years and the Government does not wish to raise it again.

The United States Supreme court handed down a decision on June 10 ordering the surrender of Charlton to the Italian officials for extradition to that country. Charlton had been in Hudson County jail in New Jersey for almost three years awaiting the outcome of his trial and appeal to the Supreme court. He has confessed having killed his wife at Lake Como in June 1910. At that time he was 21 years old and his wife was eighteen his senior. She was the divorced wife of Neville H. Castle, a San Francisco lawyer.

Charlton and his wife were on their honeymoon in a villa on Lake Como when, according to his confession, he killed her and after putting her body in a trunk threw it into the Lake. He then fled to New York and he was arrested on his arrival here.

The order for the extradition came after three years of stubborn fighting by his father, Paul Charlton, a Federal Judge in Porto Rico and a classmate and close friend of ex-President Taft. A warrant for Charlton's extradition was issued by the State Department on the demand of Italy and execution was suspended pending the result of the appeal to the Supreme Court.

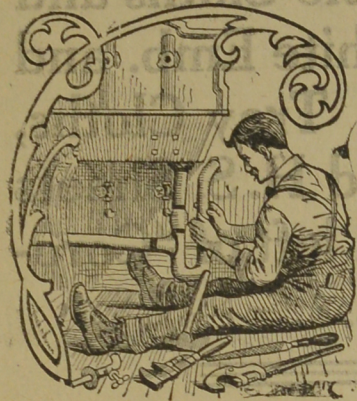

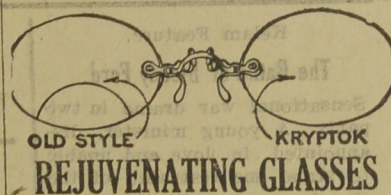

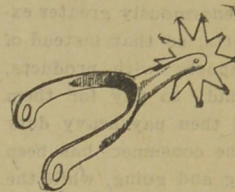
