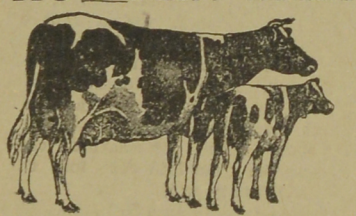

HAS OVER 75,000 STOCKHOLDERS

Philadelphia, Pa., Feb. 28—More stockholders than the company ever before had on its books shared today in the distribution of the Pennsylvania Railroad's quarterly dividend. The amount of cash disbursed was \$6,808,169. This was divided among 75,492 stockholders, which was nearly 1,000 more than the company had on its books at the November dividend period. Of the present stockholders 36,457 are women.
