STRAY TOPICS FROM LITTLE OLD NEW YORK

New York, N. Y., July 3-The recent removal of the little white cottage in which Edgar Allan Poe wrote "The Raven" and where he spent the greater part of his brief but happy wedded life, aroused great interest, and in many instances strong criticism on the part of admirers of America's poet and fictionist. The cottage stood on the Kingsbridge road in the Borough of the Bronx and was removed from the original site to a new wundation prepared for it in Poe Park, distant about two blocks. The park covers about two blocks and the cottage was placed at the northern end, preserving in all the details its appear ance on the previous site.
