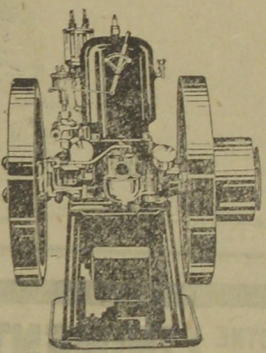

Bangor, Me., July 11--Fredericton defeated Bangor this afternoon 7 to 5 in a contest that was in doubt until the last man was retired. Both sides fielded cleanly but the visitors excelled at the bat, finding Wallace for a nice lot of safeties, four of which was contributed by Keaney who had a perfect field day with the stick.

Bangor started in the first when Connaughton banded one of Condon's shoots for the circuit in the first. The visitor's picked up two in the third, when Stone and Conley singled and Callahan drew a base on balls. Then Wallace lost a toss from Reed on White's hit and two runs resulted. In the fourth Fredericton got two more. Keaney singled and Ganley reached first on an infield error. Duggan singled and Stone hunted successfully, and Ganley scored on a sacrifice fly. Bangor got two in the same inning on three-baggers by Dolan and Tewhey and Murphy's error.

There was plenty of scoring in the ninth. Fredericton tried a bunting game very successfully and shoved three runs across the plate. Keaney's two-bagger assisting materially. Bangor started a rally with one down. Wildes walked. Mathews and Tewhey hit for two bags, the latter was out at the plate a minute later in trying to score on Wakefield's single. 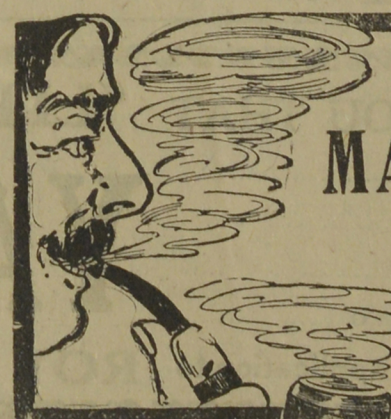
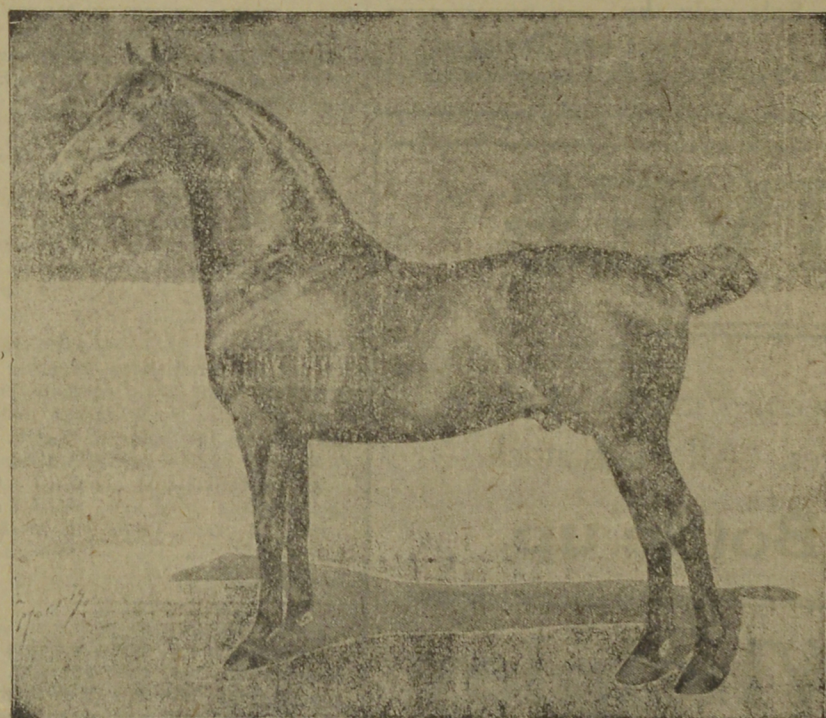
