HIS WORSHIP EXPLAINS CONCERNING HIS OFFICE

Is Willing to Permit of its Use for Meetings if Due Notice is Given

At the meeting of the City Council last night His Worship the Mayor made a statement with regard to the use of his office at the City Hall, which was the direct outcome of the incident Monday morning, when he requested the Board of Health and School Board, which were meeting jointly in the mayor's office, to vacate as the Assessment Appeals Committee was to meet there.

Last night the City Clerk read a communication from the secretary of the Board of Health requesting that the city furnish the board with a meeting room inasmuch as use of the Mayor's Office had been denied. The council took no action on the matter but His Worship made a statement as follows:

"I never have had any objection to permitting any civic body to make use of the Mayor's Office upon due notice being given. Last year for a considerable length of time, the office was used by a department not directly connected with the city government. On Monday last a meeting was held in that office without any notice being given or consent asked. I now want to advise the Board of Health or any other public body that upon twenty-four hours' notice to myself or the City Clerk, that office can be obtained if not in use."

LICENSE FEE WILL BE COLLECTED BY CITY

The firm of Falconer & McDonald, the firm of Falconer & McDonald, which is erecting the new post-office building, is to be called upon to pay a license fee of one hundred dollars in accordance with the terms of one of the city bylaws. That was the announcement made at the City Hall this morning. Mr. Fraser, superintendent for the firm, has raised the point that the work is a public one and as crown property should be taxed in the way mentioned. The city authorities claim that the contention is not valid and the collection of the fee will be made.

The matter was referred to at Monday night's meeting of the City Council in committee. Last night at the Council meeting it came up again. Ald. Farrell, seconded by Ald. Everett, moved that the license fee be collected.

Ald. Mitchell remarked in this connection that the motion was perfectly harmless and came from a harmless source.

The motion was carried and Ald. Farrell then read the section of the by-law which covers the case, and interpreted it to mean that a fee of only twenty dollars could be collected.
