Pets Broke Even With Bangor Tuesday

GOOD RACING AT HANKS' MEET ON BANGOR TRACK

Four Events Run off--Local Men in Attendance--Hal McKinney Broke Track Record

Bangor, Me., Aug. 5--Bangor's greatest racing meet--Hanks Grand Pine Tree Circuit--opened here today for four days. Four races with purses aggregating \$3,500 were run.

Hal McKinney, a bay horse by Hal B. owned and driven by Russell, of Riverside, Cal., won the 2:10 pace, breaking the track record of 2:11, made by Roan Wilkes, in the first heat, when he finished in 2:09. He took all three heats easily and the time would have been even better had he been pushed to the wire. All three heats were lower than any previous record made over the Bangor track. The purse was \$1,000.

Stratford, a brown horse, owned in Washington, Pa., and driven by the owner, Jamieson, took the three heats in the 2:25 trot, having everything his own way.

Bon Ton, a brown stallion from North Carolina, was second. The time was 2:16.

The 2:16 pace was taken by Kavak, by Kaville, a gray horse from Stratham, N.H., in three straight heats. Ethel S was second for all three heats. Kavak's best time was 2:14. In the third heat both Lady Elect and Alita Gentry led Kavak up to the last quarter when he put on a little speed and finished a length ahead.

Morine, a bay mare from Boston, took the 2:18 trot in three straight heats, best time 2:16.

A. H. Merrill of Danvers, Mass., is the starter for the meet. The judges are Chester F. Pike of Windsor, Vt.; Isiah Morrell of Brunswick, Me.; Fred G. Moon of Bangor, Harry H. Lee of Augusta, is the track superintendent and James S. Neill of Fredericton, N.B., the timer. A number of prominent New Brunswick horsemen are in attendance at the meet here.
