Sioux Falls, S. D., May 1—Rt. Rev. Thomas O'Gorman, Roman Catholic bishop of Sioux Falls, attained his seventieth birthday anniversary today. Bishop O'Gorman is a native of Boston and has long been regarded as one of the most learned prelates of the Catholic Church in America. Previous to becoming bishop of Sioux Falls in 1896 he had been president of St. Thomas college in Minnesota and a member of the faculty of the Catholic University at Washington.

## STRAY TOPICS

New York, April 26—Police Commissioner Waldo is considering a plan for improving the identification methods of the police department, which was recently suggested to him in a letter. The writer suggested to abandon the present method of taking front and side views of the features of crooks and other criminals for the rogues gallery record and to install a moving picture camera for the purpose of obtaining a more complete picture record showing not only the features but also peculiarities of expression and motion of the criminals. It is believed that five feet of film, costing about 70 cents, would suffice for each lawbreaker. Some of the police officials are favorably impressed with the plan and it is quite possible that it will be given a trial.

The opening of the trials of the four ex-Inspectors of Police who were indicted a short time ago for conspiracy to "obstruct justice" in keeping George A. Sipp, an important witness against Policeman Eugene Fox, one of the alleged police grafters, out of the State, has been set for next Monday and it is expected that the testimony to be introduced by the District Attorney will be full of sensational interest. However, the people of New York have grown so accustomed to these everlasting stories of police grafting that the evidence will have to be unusually startling to cause more than a mere ripple of public interest.

In the meantime the burglars and other crooks gathered in this city in large numbers, continue to follow their profession unconcernedly and with remarkable success. Almost daily some of the elegant residences in the most exclusive section of the city are visited by daylight burglars in their professional capacity and the aggregate value of the jewelry and other valuables stolen is estimated at hundreds of thousands of dollars. Pawnshops also receive considerable attention from burglars just now and more than a dozen of pawnshops in various parts of the city have been visited and "cleaned out" by burglars during the last two months.
