## BAD ACCIDENT ON C. P. R. BRANCH NEAR GORNISH

Special Train Collided With Pile of Rails and Two Snowplows and a Van Were Ditched---Conductor Clark had Close Call

A special train on the Fredericton branch of the C. P. R. was ditched a mile west of Rusiagornish Station at five o'clock last evening and Conductor Clarke, who was in charge, had a narrow escape from death. The train was made up of several box cars, two snowplows which were being removed from this city to McAdam, and a van. Near the spot where the accident occurred men had been at work laying new rails, and there was a large pile of the latter close to the track. The leading snowplow which projected over the track a considerable distance, collided with the pile of rails several of which jill-poked the train with disastrous results to both snowplow and the van. They left the rails and after scudding along the sleepers for a short time ran into the ditch and toppled over. The brakeman was on the locomotive at the time and Conductor Clarke was alone in the van. Fortunately he escaped with only a few bruises. The other members of the train crew also escaped injury.

The train which left the city at 5.50 o'clock was delayed two hours in reaching the junction but the C. P. R. and Boston trains were held.

A wrecking crew will be sent to the scene of the accident to restore the plows and van to the rails.

## FIRE STATION PROBLEM REOPENED BY COMMITTEE

Recommends That Council Authorize Erection of New Station on Present Central Site if Large Enough ---Favors Motor Track

The Fire Committee met last night and discussed the question of procuring a motor-truck and also of building a new central fire station. The full committee was not present and the matter probably will be discussed later at another committee meeting.

Those present last night were Ald. Hoben the chairman, Ald. Rogers, Ald. Scott, Chief Rutter and Assistant Chief Clark. The committee before adjourning passed the following recommendation.

"That authority be asked of the City Council for the committee to proceed at once with the erection of a new fire station on the present central station site sufficiently large to accommodate the present apparatus and also a new combined motor chemical engine and hose truck provided that the lot is found upon examination to be sufficiently large to afford the accommodation required."

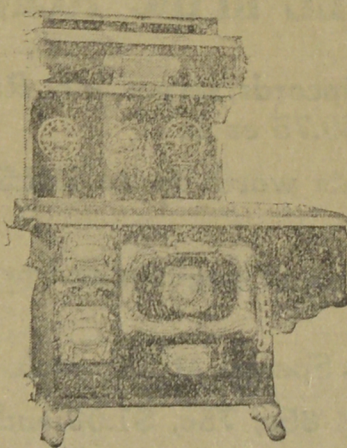

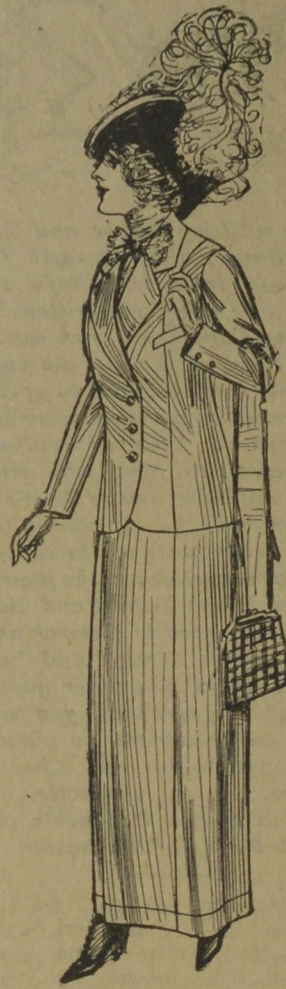
