





Speaker Sproule called Mr. Mac-Kenzie's attention to "the fact that the hon. member is not keeping to the discussion of the resolution now efore the house." He ought to renumber that there was a resolution before the house and to discuss the

merits or demerits of the constitutionally of any other measure seem-Mr. MacKenzie said he must bow to

the speaker's ruling, but submitted that there must be grave reason for the gag resolution before the house before the government was authorized to pass it. He was seeking to show that no such condition existed. 'If I can show there is no reason for introducing the resolution, I am within my rights," he maintained. Mr. German followed in a speech pulsating with indignation. He declared that the procedure of the premier and his government in preventing Sir Wilfrid Laurier from speaking was "the most disgraceful thing that had ever happened in Canadian parliamentary history." It manifestd neither the manliness of a states man or the courage of a brave man. The only proper course was to have followed all precedent Canadian or British and have referred any pro-posed amendment of the rules to a All w ommittee with the speaker to thresh them out in an amicable discussion. Of the Borden resolution Mr. Ger nan said it was conceived in iniqui v and born in sin. It was "ur ighteous and villainous and was degned to destroy the fundamental principle of parliamentary control o the public purse." He said its presentation "was absolutely hyprcritical' the worst of steam roller me-thods had been followed. Mr. Borden said that the government had first attempted "physical force" but the vellow thread in the woof of its con stitution became manifest. They got here to spend Sunday with his fam scared, as the boys would say, and ily now they seek to do it by subversion of the fundamental principles of self government.

"What will the Government do?" sked Mr. German. "It will force this bill through the house of comons, but sir, this house of comons does not hold all the Liberals who occupy positions in the parlia ment of Canada. 




