A DROP IN THE BUCKET

During seven years of Liberal administration in England the British national debt has been reduced by £63,000,000 according to a statement recently made by Lloyd George, the Chancellor of the Exchequer, in the British House of Commons, This means a reduction of debt of about \$45,000,000 a year, or \$10,000,000 a year more than the Borden "emergency" donation. In addition to this during the past three years the British Government has provided for an extra expenditure of £13,500,000 on the navy, over and above the ordinary program of shipbuilding, dock construction, etc.—an extra expendi- Personal subscriptions ture in three years of \$67,500,000, or almost twice the amount of the Bor- Old Home Week balance den gift, which will take, at least, three years to turn into ships. 
