## CHARLES TITUS, OF GIBSON KILLED BY RUNAWAY

Was Driving Load of Wood Mill-Wood in York Street--Horse Was Frightened by Steam Roller--Crushed by Wheels

Charles Titus of Gibson, was killed at 2.30 o'clock this afternoon as the result of his horse running away after taking fright from the city's steam-roller. He was thrown from the seat of the wagon in which he was driving and was crushed in some manner by the wheels, dying in a few minutes.

The accident occurred at the corner of York and Brunswick streets. The steam-roller was standing on the north crossing. The horse shied in front of Dr. G. C. VanWart's residence and ran away, in spite of the fact that it was attached to a heavy load of wood being brought by the driver from the York & Sunbury Mill. Messrs. A. C. Fleming and J. H. Fleming were standing near by talking with Roadmaster H. C. Jewett. Mr. A. C. Flemming says that the man was jarred from his seat when the fore wheels of the wagon struck the concrete catch-basin at Dr. VanWart's corner. He fell on the other side of the load of wood out of sight and next was seen on the ground in front of the Brunswick Street Baptist Church, the horse running out York street. Mr. Fleming rushed over to him and found him unconscious and terribly crushed and torn about the head and upper part of the body. He was carried by bystanders across the street and placed on Mr. J. F. VanBuskirk's lawn. Dr. G. C. VanWart was summoned from his residence but could do nothing for the unfortunate man who was dead in a few minutes.

Dr. Wainwright, coroner, was informed of the accident and viewed the remains.

The deceased was aged fifty-five years and was a well-known and highly respected resident of Gibson. A widow survives, also four sons, Arthur, Frederick, Frank and Charles. Charles, the only unmarried son, lives with his parents, Frederick lives in St. John and the others in Gibson.

The coroner's jury is as follows: Elwood Allen, Marysville; E. G. Merritt, Barker's Point; A. K. Lim-

## GAVRILICO FOUND GUILTY OF FORGERY LAST EVENING

Jury Was Out Half an Hour--Prisoner Threatened Witness After Verdict was Given--Ardauskauk Trial Today

After being out half an hour the jury trying the case of Nikita Gavrilico, the Russian before the York County Court on the charge of forgery, brought in a verdict of guilty last evening. The charge against Gavrilico was that of raising a pay-check issued on the Royal Bank of contractors on the St. John & Quebec Road by Smith & Merrithew, sub-contractor whose work is in the parish of Kingsclear. Gavrilico raised the check of another Russian laborer named Ardauskauk, who attempted to cash it at the local branch of the bank but was caught in the attempt.

Gavrilico took his sentence calmly but after leaving the court-room saw a witness who had testified against him and threatened him fearfully in Russian.

Ardauskauk is being tried today on the charge of uttering a forged check. R. B. Hanson prosecuted in both cases and P. A. Guthrie defends.

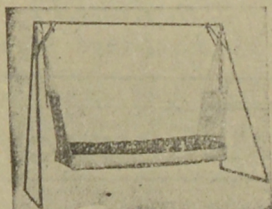
