## NEW BRUNSWICK

## DISCONTENTED

(Montreal Witness)

Keen dissatisfaction with the treatment of the province of New Brunswick and the city of St. John in particular is receiving at the hands of the Federal Government is felt in that province, according to the Hon. Wm. Pugsley, minister of public works in the late Administration, who is in Montreal today en route from Toronto to St. John. The late Government, Mr. Pugsley said, secured a tract of fifty acres on Courtenay

Bay, St. John, for the purpose of providing terminals for the Transcontinental Railway and improved harbor facilities, but no more is being made by the powers that be at Ottawa to construct the works. Mr. Pugsley also declared that the people of New Brunswick were opposed to a direct contribution to the Imperial navy, and favored Canadian built ships. So strong was this general dissatisfaction in the province that he had no hesitation in saying that if an election were to take place tomorrow the Liberal majority of eight members sent to Ottawa by New Brunswick against five Conservatives would be increased.

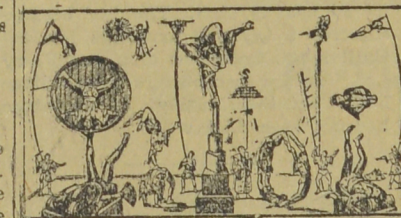
