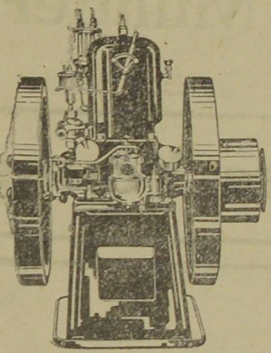

At Expense of St. CroixConden's Home Run Wallop and Conley's Batting
Feature of Game--Lynch Also There With the
Willow--Keaney Pulls off One, His Usual Stunt

The Pets have started another week under most auspicious circumstances, taking both games played on the local diamond. The same conditions characterized both contests, the locals coming up from behind and winning by a grand eighth inning rally, after handing out a commanding lead in the first. The game had all the symptoms of a thriller. Pete Condin, the Pets twirler, had a great reception on joining to the mound, the border contingent showing the appreciation of his presence by connecting with a base on balls, and then rapping out four consecutive hits, one single, a double and two triples. It looks as if Pete would get the high sign but Manager Ganley's confidence was well justified when Condin settled down in the second and with good fielding behind him allowed the St. Croix's but one run for the balance of the game and that was batted in on a squeeze play in the sixth.

ST. CROIX SCORES

St. Croix opened up in the first, Parker got a base but was out stealing second on a strike out by McPherson. But with two down the visitors went to Condon and had garnered in three runs before being retired by a pop-fly to Callahan. They got one more in the sixth when Lynch drove out his second triple of the game and scored in a squeeze play, Gross being the sacrifice.

The lead taken by Manager Doyle's warriors began to look larger and larger as the game proceeded, with Lee breezing along in major league, but a home run wallop by Condon in the seventh was the turning point of the game. The clout had a visible effect on the St. Croix man, and the locals took advantage of his weakening in the next inning by putting three runs across.

HOW WE SCORED

The Pets started in the fourth when Keaney was safe on Lynch's error to catch him at first, going to second on the heave, Ganley scored him from there on a hit to centre but was out himself trying to steal second. Stone got a two bagger but was left on base. Two more came in the seventh when Conley hit to right and Condon brought him in with a home run wallop to the same quarter. The latter got a great hand from the fans on competing of the circuit. The eighth however was the big one, Stone got a base on balls, Callahan a life on Tetrault's error, and both scored on Conley's slashing drive to right field. White was out, Lynch to Vance, but Murphy connected with another double to left bringing Conley over with the last count.

Pease failed to register at first in the fifth making the third out, with the result that he lost credit for a two-base hit and his team were one run less than they should have been.

Murphy pulled off a bush stunt in the fifth when he can off first forcing Conley at second. The latter attempted to make third but was an easy out.

There were some elaborate heaves let loose yesterday, Lynch, Callahan and Condon getting in a nice juicy one a piece.

Lee had the Indian sign on all the Pets except Conley. But was there, however in his old time form and his wallops were timely.

Mr. Doyle, newspaper critic, et al, had the nervous feeling in the eighth when the St. Croix team aviated.

That squeeze play was good ball, but the Pets infield should have had a weather eye open as the outlook bore all the ear marks.

Condon's home run took the steam out of Lee and practically broke up the game.

Lee fanned three of the Pets in one, two, three order in the second.

The Pets made some awful swings at the bad ones.

Keaney held Lynch at third in great style while making at first.

Bangor, Me., July 3--St. John defeated Bangor by a score of 9 to 6. The game was featured by heavy hitting by the visitors.

St. John scored four runs in the first and drove McLellen to the stable. O'Brien got apass. Pinkerton sacrificed him. Shankey was next up and hit to Tewhey, who put O'Brien out. Tewhey to Connaughton, and Connaughton doubled Shankey at first. Black hit one for the circuit scoring Pinkerton ahead of him. Watt and Bien both singled and Riley came across with one for three sacks, cleaning up the bases. He died on third when Ramsey went out Connaughton to Reed.
