not to try the case but to see if enough evidence was given to warrant a conviction provided no reply was given or defence put in.

His Honor also informed the members of the jury that it was within their province to visit the public institutions such as the goal almshouses, etc., and to suggest any reforms that they might think were needed. "The grand jury was an old institution" said His Honor "and its duties comprised not only the rendering of verdicts in criminal actions but the suggestion of reforms which might benefit the public."

In returning to the case before the court, His Honor said there was two counts, (1) the crime itself and (2) an attempt to commit. The former of a necessity included the latter, but he was of the opinion that little difficulty would be found in finding a true bill on both counts.

FOUND TRUE BILL.

The grand jury retired to the jury room to deliberate on the case and to hear the evidence of witnesses. The following witnesses were called: J. L. Marsh, police magistrate; Jas. Roberts, detective; Fay Minue, the girl preferring the charge, and Martha J. Minue, mother of the girl in question. After evidence was taken and consideration being given, the grand jury found a true bill, following which the indictment endorsed, true bill was submitted by the foreman.
