will depend upon the result of the first Irish election. 'It is hoped in Nationalist circles that arrangements may be made with the Bank of Ireland, whereby the old Parliament House on College Green may be restored to its constitutional function. The chamber of Irish House of Lords remains much as it was, and if it were devoted to the Irish senate, it would be here that the opening ceremony would naturally be enacted and the king's speech read. It is the present hope that under home rule the Duke of Connaught may be lord lieutenant of Ireland.

## REDMOND'S POLICY

'The character of Mr. Redmond's policy will be what in this country would be called conservative. It may be taken as certain that the main desire of responsible persons will be to respect the susceptibilities and pay honor to the high character of the Protestant counties.

'In the event of an Irish election taking place, the Ulstermen, according to present intentions will be counselled not to vote. Drilling is undoubtedly proceeding in four counties but it must be clearly understood that there will be no shooting down of these levees unless its absolutely necessary to protect the lives and property of the Catholic minority.

'It is anticipated that the Royal assent to the home rule bill will be signed about the month of June next year. The act will come into operation on the first Tuesday in the eighth month after that month, which would be the first Tuesday in February 1915, but by an order in council the imperial government can antedate the operation by seven months or post-date it seven months and it may be assumed that the operation of the act will not take effect until after the general election of 1915 for the United Kingdom.

## PITTSBURG BANK

## CRASH DISASTROUS

Washington, July 8—Secretary McAdoo will ask Attorney General McReynolds within a few days to investigate alleged irregularities in the conduct of the First-Second National Bank of Pittsburgh, which closed its doors yesterday. The secretary today definitely decided to refer the decision to the department of justice, and is now engaged in the collection of all the facts connected with the management of the big bank to prepare the attorney general for an inquiry designed to develop whether there was any violation of the law in connection with the failure. John N. Williams, assistant secretary of the treasury, today returned from Pittsburgh, where he superintended the closing of the bank, and reported that the institution had been "seriously mismanaged," necessitating a reference of the conditions to the department of justice.

Thomas P. Kano, acting comptroller of the currency, by long distance telephone late today advised Secretary McAdoo that the receivership was progressing satisfactorily and reiterated that the general banking conditions in Pittsburgh were sound. Treasury officials continued not only confident that there would be no more trouble, but emphasized the belief that the closing of the First-Second actually had improved conditions in Pittsburgh by removing a doubtful element from the financial system.

The latest reports to the treasury department indicate that the losses of the First-Second Bank may reach \$5,500,000, because the entire capital and surplus of the bank now seems to have been wiped out.

These advices were accompanied by assurances from officers of the bank that the depositors whose claims total about \$38,000,000, probably would be paid in full or nearly in full through realization on the bank's assets.

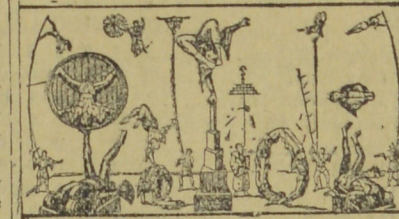
