C. P. R. WEAKENING
IN REGARD TO FREIGHT
RATES TO FREDERICTONH. E. MacDonell and W. B. Bamford
in City Conferring With Board of
Trade Re Concessions Demanded
By Local PeopleH. E. Macdonell, General Freight
Agent for C.P.R. lines east of Port
William, Ont., and W. B. Bamford of
St. John, District Freight Agent for
the C.P.R. conferred yesterday after-
noon and last evening with the spe-
cial committee of the Board of Trade
which was connected with the pre-
paration of the brief on discrimina-
tion in passenger and freight rates
made against Fredericton by the
C.P.R. Those officials of the railway
will confer further with the Trans-
portation Committee of the Board of
Trade this afternoon.There is now a tendency on the
part of the C.P.R. to grant conces-
sions to the business men of this
city and if the Board of Trade can
obtain from the railway what is de-
sired it is probable that certain sec-
tions may be struck out of the brief
which was forwarded to the Rail-
way Commission. The sections deal-
ing with the passenger rates how-
ever will not be affected by any con-
cessions made by Mr. Macdonell.J. W. McCready who is acting as
counsel for the Board of Trade in
connection with the brief before the
Railway Commission was present at
yesterday's conference also Pres. J.
T. Jennings, C. F. Chestnut, chair-
man of the Transportation Commit-
tee and others.
