MR. CODERRE TO OUIT

It is stated, and practically admitted in government organs, that Hon. Louis Coderre, secretary of state, is soon to resign and be succeeded by Mr. L. T. Marechal, a well known Montreal lawyer. It is further stated that the discredited secretary of state is to be appointed to the bench Hon. Louis Coderre was brought into the Borden government on October 30th last, to replace the Hon. F. D. Monk, who had to resign because he could not honorably stay with a government whose course was in dir- enchre him out of it. There will ect opposition to the platform on which he was elected. Hon. Mr. Coderre contented himself with a blank denial of the charges and declared that the whole thing was a blackmailing scheme. This was quite sufficient to satisfy Premier Borden-although he is supposed to be a lawyer of parts-and he immediately called upon his followers to whitewash Hon. Mr. Coderre and they did so with the same unanimity that they exhibited before in whitewashing Hon. Mr. Rogers in the Macdonald by-election scandal.

Hon. Mr. Coderre was promptly challenged to take criminal proceedings against the men he had accused of perjury and blackmail but although four months have elapsed since then, nothing has been done. It appears that the evidence which so easily satisfied the partisan group be-






