OUTWITS DIVORCED WIFE BY TRICK

Jersey City, Aug. 5.—James F. Fryer, a wealthy retired merchant of Jersey City, has got from his divorced wife, by stratagem, the possession of the five younger children of the couple, and is now half way across the continent with them, bound for California.

Though Mr. Fryer started on his long journey Friday night, it was not until yesterday that the news of his movements and a clue to the whereabouts of the children became publicly known in Jersey City.

It is said that Mrs. Fryer did not learn until last night where her children have gone.

Mr. Fryer is thirty-eight and his wife thirty-five. The couple separated last November, and some time afterward the husband began a suit for divorce on statutory grounds. The evidence was heard by a special master, John S. McMaster, and he recommended that a divorce be given to the husband.

The court granted the divorce and also awarded the custody of the children to the husband. One of the children, a boy, seventeen, had been living with the father at No. 211 Second street, Jersey City. The five others of the offspring had been living with their mother at No. 24 Laidlaw avenue, Jersey City.

According to Mr. Fryer's close friends, he feared trouble and possibly the necessity of using force unless he got the five children from their mother by some sort of a scheme. Accordingly, a week ago, he sent his oldest boy to Mrs. Fryer's home to invite the others to go with him on an outing to Coney Island.

Mrs. Fryer let four of the children go, but kept the youngest, a girl of five, at home. Mr. Fryer took the other children to the island, let them ride the merry-go-round to their hearts' content, and sent them back to their mother.

On Friday last he again sent the eldest boy to the mother to invite the children to another excursion to Coney Island. This time the mother, it is said, was off her guard and let all five of the youngsters go, with the oldest boy.

Fryer was in waiting and he took his children to South Beach by trolley. There, by previous arrangement, he had an automobile in waiting, and after the children had had their outing he bundled them all into the touring car and away they went to Newark, where at 6.41 p. m. they caught a train for the West.

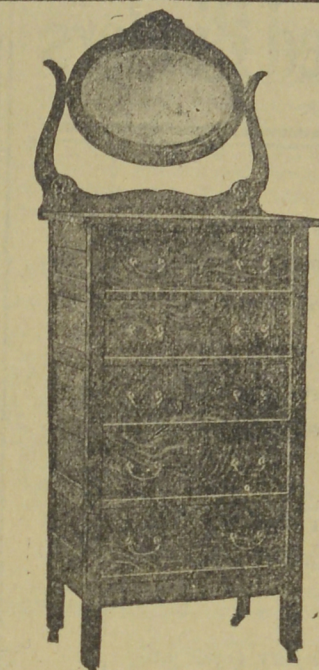
